2. Noss Primary School 20mph speed limit - traffic order.

IM talked to his presentations and answered several questions from the audience.

Topics raised were:-

One unhappy with 24/7 blanket with 20mph. Felt this was being imposed on motorists.

20 mph signs are uncovered at present and are causing confusion with motorists and pedestrians. IM would arrange to get the signs covered over again. **ACTION**

Why does 20mph stop at Seaview?

After Seaview one side is open fields so not looked on as being an urban road.

Traffic Orders are a legal process and cannot be short circuited. Process is clear and very timeline driven. If no objections should be in place by late May/early June

IM sitting with many Traffic Orders to look at. Members to decide priority after briefing from IM on 21st March.
