2.	Previous Minutes – 24th February 2016 <u>District Plans Update</u> A pilot is currently taking place in North and there has been positive	

	<p>There has been consultation with young people, the aim is that they will help shape the direction we are going in. Data sharing with school is also being looked at in relation to survey data.</p> <p><u>Mental Health</u> – Sally – The focus just now is around infant and parental mental health.</p> <p>The tier four service are recruiting at the moment.</p> <p>Mental health funding is going to psychologists, this will make a big difference.</p> <p><u>Transitions</u> – Sally – The next meeting is in June, work is still ongoing and discussions are taking place in Raigmore.</p> <p><u>Play</u> – Cath – Smithton Primary School won the Play Award for their out of school club and their green leaf garden, the award is going to be presented to them at Committee on 18th May.</p> <p>We have a new strategy and improvement plan, it is hoped that this will put Play firmly back on the political agenda.</p> <p>Gillian has been leading on consultation with young people in Ullapool, feedback has been positive.</p> <p>It has been noted that it would be helpful to progress engagement with education in relation to accessing school grounds outside school hours.</p> <p><u>Health and Wellbeing</u> – Cath – QI 2.1 was carried out as part of the self-evaluation of the group and a new driver diagram has been developed. The focus of the group has changed slightly, it now looks at monitoring health activity within groups, what evidence there is and how we use it.</p> <p><u>Supporting Improvement Co-ordination Group</u> – Cath – This group looks at co-ordinating work of the national collaboratives.</p> <p>A learning network has been launched, this matches participants up to a mentor who works with you throughout the process. The learning network team are to be invite to the next group.</p>	
5.	<p>National Third Sector GIRFEC – Final Report</p> <p>The final report details the voices of our third sector partners and takes forward the findings of a wide ranging piece of work. Our engagement in working across partnerships is quite strong but page 6 of the report notes that we need to formalise things to ensure they are being done correctly. The report also adds that we need to ensure the third sector apply the principles of GIRFEC. It is important that the third sector is involved when developing plans locally.</p>
