3 Army Welfare Service	Action
Nicola and Tracie presented on the services offered under AWS. Information was given as to what is provided in the way of a confidential non-discriminatory support service that responds to the needs of the service community. 4 VAW Priorities	Action
Gillian stated that Priority 1 and 2 were very similar, therefore it was agreed that we would merge those 2 priorities, albeit insuring that the issue of contact remained prominent. Gillian will meet with Donna Munro to progress issues relating to training. All other priorities were discussed by the group. Fiona stated that it should be about determining what is for Action in 2016 and how realistic it is and to determine the 'Priorities'. High Priorities as 1 – 7 which should be focused on and others as low priority. Gillian to update actions 1-7 on progress as to who is doing it and what has happened. It was pointed out that a number of priorities are for health and in terms of NHS representation; we require to seek a health rep., Gillian to speak to Elaine regarding this. 5 Sexual Violence Prevention Pack - RASASH	Action
Melody reported on where they are with the SV Prevention Pack. The packs were distributed sometime ago to those folk who were previously trained to deliver on Sexual Violence Prevention. It was evident that those folk who were to deliver did not feel confident in doing so and hence nothing was delivered. It was agreed to ask for the packs back and look at alternatives on how to deliver the training. Melody stated this proved to be challenging and it was agreed to indentify folk who would be suitable for delivering and not teachers as recognised in the evaluation of the programme. On looking for someone to deliver the training, it was discussed to look at Children's Service Workers and Development Officers rather than focussing on teachers. Suggestions were made that Melody could hold taster sessions for staff in different areas and to contact folk who they think would be good to deliver. 6 National Guidance for VAWP's Gillian stated that there is nothing within the Draft Guidance that is surprising to us. This is only guidance and nothing to say that this is a must, but rather a guidance to say 'it would be good if' This guidance is not out yet and will be ratified by the Scottish Government and then made available. 7 VAWP Self Assessment	Action
Jo has now agreed to come to Highland and conduct the self assessment with us at the December VAWP meeting. This meeting would require to be extended to a 3 hour meeting, which Gillian has informed members about and most have come back to say this is ok for them. There will be some work to be done prior to the self assessment and Jo will send the assessment 6 weeks prior to meeting and which should then be completed individually by all members. RWA have conducted focus groups with women in relation to services they have used – this can provide some feedback Survey monkey could be used to get a wider range of views We should also engage with staff on their views of policies, training and current responses to help shape the next action plan IWA are conducting a small scale survey with women in relation to reducing escalation of domestic abuse (for those below MARAC risk thresholds) – this could be replicated elsewhere NHS Highland PIN Policy review – seeking views of the NHSH work force on how the policy is used and what staff would value in terms of staff It was gueried if Alison Clark, Highland Council, might be able to put specific Violence Against Women guestions to the Citizen's Panel Melody noted that the Stand Up volunteers at RASASH may be interested in shaping the future action plan in relation to children and young people Youth Parliament has recently focused on sexual violence – it would be worth exploring what the outcomes of that have been Gillian It was agreed that Gillian would pull a framework for consultation and ΑII engagement together for the group.
