Care and Learning Capital Programme – Monitoring Report

Report by Director of Care and Learning

Summary

This report outlines the position of the Care and Learning capital programme as at the end of January 2017 along with the current status of the major projects that are underway. The report also sets out a review of Care and Learning capital programme priorities for consideration by Members, along with some specific proposals that are recommended for approval.

1. Capital Monitoring Position

1.1 **Appendix 1** sets out the monitoring position for the current financial year as at the end of January 2017. Further details of the approved budget figures and the estimated final outturns are included in the table below. The main reason for the increase in income is that grant funding from the Scottish Government for Portree Gaelic Primary School can be drawn down this financial year.

1.2 The Council's overall capital programme includes significant overprogramming in 2016/17. The projected under-spend on the Care and Learning programme is a key element in the management of the overall programme and is regularly reviewed with colleagues in Finance.

2. Major Projects

- 2.1 **Appendix 2** summarises the current status of all major projects (i.e. those with a total project cost exceeding £1M) in the Care and Learning capital programme. The appendix compares the key programme dates and the total project cost with the baseline position of the capital programme approved in March 2015 and subsequently reviewed in December 2015.
- Alness Academy: As previously reported, it had been expected that this Committee would receive a report setting out an affordability cap for the Alness project, as part of the 'New Project Request' (NPR) milestone. Further discussions have been taking place with the 2 other North Council's collaborating with Highland on this schools programme (Moray and Aberdeenshire) and with the Scottish Futures Trust, to ensure that there has been suitable opportunity for review and comparison of project briefing and

specification across the North programme, to maximise opportunities for efficiencies.

- As such, the finalisation of the NPR affordability has been slipped, with that now expected to be finalised in early March once these collaborative discussions have concluded. This Committee had previously agreed to delegation arrangements for finalisation of the NPR, and these would be used with a report back to Committee in June. - 2.4 **Strontian Primary:** Previous reports to this Committee have provided updates on progress with the community project to develop and build a new facility, which will be leased to the Council for the provision of a new Primary School for Strontian. The current position is that Strontian Community School Building Limited (SCSBL) are very well advanced in meeting their ambitious fundraising target, are anticipating loan finance approval mid-March, and are expecting to conclude land purchase and award of the construction contract shortly thereafter.
- A key activity is to formalise the terms of the lease and funding package with Highland Council. Previous reports have indicated the affordability assumptions that the Council had been working to and discussing with SCSBL, which involved a lease of £55k p.a. and the Council meeting or contributing to one-off fit-out costs of up to £190k. Members are asked to formalise funding arrangements with SCSBL, the detail of which would be delegated to the Head of Resources, with formal approval in relation to a lease being via the Resources Committee and the existing delegation arrangements during the purdah period.

3. Capital Programme Priorities

- 3.1 As highlighted in the report to this Committee in January, the review of the overall capital programme that was reported to Council in December 2016 resulted in the Chair of this Committee arranging early discussions with other senior Members.
- 3.2 The intention was that the report to this meeting would include a number of key recommendations on future priorities and any necessary adjustments to the capital programme. It is essential that this Committee arrives at a clear position on future priorities to inform the anticipated review of the overall capital programme later this year.
- 3.3 The subsequent review has taken the following approach:
 - Consideration of the Approved Capital Programme (Major Projects Not Yet Legally Committed): The recommended approach is that these projects, as listed in Appendix 4, should continue to be progressed, with the possible exception of the Black Isle Education Centre (pending a final decision on the future of the facility) and the Residential Unit for Children

with Autism (currently under review).

- Outline Business Cases (OBCs): Care and Learning submitted 13 OBC's for consideration as part of the review of the capital programme undertaken in 2016. Care and Learning Officers, in liaison with the Chair and other senior Members, have reviewed these OBC's and recommended a priority order as set out in Appendix 5. Note that some of the OBCs on this list are also referred to in the section on Inverness Schools.
- Inverness Schools: Officers have undertaken a number of Member briefings over the past year, which have informed the identification of key priorities across Inverness. Latest school roll forecasts and core fact statistics (condition, sufficiency and suitability) have been used by officers to identify a proposed priority order and phasing of school projects. This information was discussed most recently at a Member Seminar on 20th February, and the outcome of this was endorsed by the City of Inverness Area Committee on 23rd February. The outcome of this is summarised in Appendix 6.
- Life Cycle Investment: A review of the relative priority of other pressures and emerging issues, along with the outcomes of recently completed feasibility studies, has been undertaken, and the conclusions are set out in Appendix 7. It should be noted that this involves projects that are likely to cost in excess of £250,000. There would also be annual programmes to address smaller value works. The availability of funding to progress all of these would be dependent on the outcome of the OBC that has been submitted for Life Cycle Investment.
- **Appendix 8** consolidates all of the prioritised Care and Learning projects listed above for consideration by Members.
- 3.4 The potential funding gap, being the differential between the projects listed within the attached appendices, and the currently approved capital programme, is set out below:

- 3.5 As previously stated, the strategic review of capital to be undertaken later this year will need to consider the affordability of the capital programme, determine priorities, and make key decisions to address the funding gap within both the Care and Learning and the overall Council capital programme.
- 3.6 Pending this wider review of the capital programme, Care and Learning does need to continue to progress the most immediate priorities at this time, where

these can be accommodated within the existing programme. This Committee agreed a number of key priorities in January for officers to progress, and the following are now also highlighted for consideration by this Committee:

- Fortrose Academy: A feasibility study was completed for the refurbishment of the older buildings and this led to an OBC being submitted last year. However, the condition of some of the areas in the school is giving cause for concern, and a further assessment of the most immediate issues is underway. It is likely that some capital investment will be required in the immediate future, and it is proposed that approval in principle is given to progress with a project to address these issues with funding allocated from the Life Cycle Investment budget. Further details will be brought back to the next meeting of this Committee in June.
- Inverness Primary Schools: The report to this Committee in January highlighted that there are several schools with pressing capacity and suitability issues that would require classroom units to be installed, and that these would be confirmed at this meeting. These schools are at Hilton, Holm, Merkinch and Smithton and approval is sought to progress these projects with funding allocated from the Roll Pressures budget allocation.
- Merkinch Primary School: As recognised in the prioritisation exercise, there are a number of pressing reasons to progress the provision for Merkinch, and preparatory work should continue, albeit this is not yet agreed as a major project in the programme.
- Smithton Primary School: As agreed by this Committee in January, detailed design work is being undertaken on a project to extend and partially refurbish the school. The estimated cost of this project is approximately £4m, and it is proposed that this should progress with funding allocated from the Inverness SSER budget allocation.
- 3.7 **Roll Pressures:** As well as the annual programme of works covered by the Life Cycle Investment budget heading, as outlined above, there is an annual allocation to address roll pressures in schools. These works typically include small to medium extensions or alterations, installation of modular units and alterations for pupils with Additional Support Needs. These projects are generally demand led or reactive in some cases. However, it is evident that an extension will be required to be in place at Ben Wyvis Primary School by August 2018. It is therefore recommended that design work should start on this in the near future and be funded from the Roll Pressures budget heading.
- 3.8 **Modular Buildings:** It was also previously reported that one of the outcomes of the report to Council in December was that there would be a particular emphasis on identifying the projects that will ensure the Council meets all of its legal and statutory requirements in the most cost-effective way. This may include looking at different models of delivery, such as the use of modular units, where appropriate. A report has been commissioned from a consultant that looks at the relative merits of the various forms of modular and off-site construction. Further consideration will be given to this in the coming months and this will also take account of the Council's recent experience of similar projects.

4 School Estate Management Plan

4.1 Local authorities are required by the Scottish Government to have a School Estate Management Plan (SEMP). This is a key tool in assessing future need, helping to prioritise decisions on capital investment, ensuring that decisions are consistent with service requirements, providing a context for appraising and evaluating capital projects, and maximising value for money. Given some of the recent initiatives that have been undertaken (school capacity modelling, review of roll forecasts, suitability surveys, assessment of priorities etc.), it is proposed that an updated SEMP is produced that will help to support the consideration of the priorities for the Care and Learning Service that are set out in this report. Local authorities are required by the Scottish Government to have a School Estate Management Plan (SEMP). This is a key tool in assessing future need, helping to prioritise decisions on capital investment, ensuring that decisions are consistent with service requirements, providing a context for appraising and evaluating capital projects, and maximising value for money. 5. Implications

- 5.1 **Resource:** As set out in this report and appendices.
- 5.2 **Legal:** There are no particular implications to highlight.
- 5.3 **Equalities:** There are no particular implications to highlight.
- 5.4 **Climate Change/Carbon Clever:** All major projects aim to improve the carbon emissions associated with the existing provision, where this is feasible
- 5.5 **Risk**: Risk assessment and ongoing monitoring is undertaken as part of capital project management. The enhanced capital monitoring in relation to major projects improves risk management arrangements and visibility to members of the current position for these projects.
- Gaelic: This report advises on the current position with regard to the new Portree Gaelic Primary School that is under construction and updates on the review of Inverness Schools which includes assessing options to address capacity issues at Bun-sgoil Ghàidhlig Inbhir Nis.
- 5.7 **Rural:** Capital investment is directed to both rural and urban Care and Learning facilities. In relation to school statutory consultations, rural factors are taken account of as required by legislation.

Recommendations

Members are asked to consider the capital monitoring report, and:

- To note progress with the Strontian community project and agree that funding terms are formalised with Strontian Community School Building Limited, the detail of which is delegated to the Head of Resources, and reported back to this Committee, as Paragraph 2.3;
- ii. Agree the proposed 2017/18 Programme as listed in Appendix 3;
- iii. Agree the revised list of capital priorities for the Care and Learning Service as set out in Appendices 4 to 7, and consolidated in Appendix 8;
- iv. Agree the recommended actions in relation to the projects at Fortrose Academy, Inverness Primary Schools, Merkinch Primary School and Smithton Primary School as Paragraph 3.6;
- v. Agree that design work should commence on an extension to Ben Wyvis Primary School, to be funded from the Roll Pressures budget allocation, as Paragraph 3.7.
