4.	Core Path review - MD	
	Working on plan. Making contact with Landowners re. any new paths. Receiving more feedback now as being in direct contact. Slight concerns raised over increase in user numbers due to promotion of core paths. Paths need to be promoted on the ground e.g. more finger points. Plans to have core paths noted on OS maps. More signage also needed which BM noted would make an improvement to the Yarrows trail. Scotways can supply a catalogue of Rights of Way <u>https://www.scotways.com/</u> Stalking concerns raised over deer being moved from landowner to landowner by access rights users. No core paths run up hills. Foresters have a duty of care to protect the public hence core paths may be closed due to felling but alternative route should be provided to avoid dangers.	
	MD now has the experience in core paths over the years and is happy to take questions from all interested parties.	
	Altnabreac railway crossing – this was removed by Ministers. Highland Council want to promote to put this back in the plan. 2013 white paper on level crossings has still to be debated by Scottish Government.	
	John O'Groats caravan site – Highland Council carried out two spends on repairing this path which was washed away both times and will not carry out repairs again until suitable coastal protection is in place. It would not be a unique case to go through the caravan site although there could be local opposition. MD will speak to local Community Council and members.	MD
