## Purpose/Executive Summary

1.1 This report sets out a request from a developer to create addresses for a mixed housing development scheme consisting of 21 units. Ward Members considered and supported the proposal put forward by the developer – Raasay Court. However, as the properties were nearing completion the naming requests were considered a matter of urgency and were brought before Ward Members, resulting in this report coming to the Lochaber Committee for homologation.

However as the properties were nearing completion, the naming requests were considered a matter of urgency and were brought before Ward Members, resulting in this report coming to the Lochaber Committee for homologation.
