Report title: Taxi driver's knowledge test

Report by: The Principal Solicitor – Regulatory Services

1. Purpose/Executive Summary

1.1 This report relates to a request received that the Committee consider lowering the pass mark for the Highland-wide section of the taxi driver's knowledge test.

2. Recommendation

2.1 Members are invited to consider whether to agree to a request made to the Taxi/PHC Sub Group at a recent meeting with taxi/PHC operators that the pass mark for the Highlandwide section of the taxi driver's knowledge test be lowered to below 85% and, if so, what the lower pass mark should be.

3. Background

- 3.1 Section 13(5) of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 (the "Act") allows a licensing authority to require an applicant for a taxi driver's licence to take a test of his/her knowledge of the area to which the licence is to relate, of the layout of roads in that area and such other matters relating to the operation of a taxi as the authority considers desirable. The authority may refuse to grant a licence to a person who does not satisfy them that he has adequate knowledge of any of these matters.
- 3.2 The Highland Council requires all new applicants for a taxi driver's licence to pass a knowledge test. As a licence issued by the Council permits the licence holder to drive a taxi for hire anywhere in the Council's area, the knowledge test is in two sections: the Highland-wide section and the local area section. All applicants must sit both sections of the test, but they can choose which local area section to sit. An applicant would normally chose the local section for the area of Highland in which he or she lives or is intending to operate in.
- 3.3 A sample taxi driver's knowledge test is attached at APPENDIX 1 for members' information. The sample is not updated, so may refer to premises which have now relocated etc. However the purpose of the sample is simply to allow applicants an opportunity to familiarise themselves in advance with the format that the test will take and the types of questions which will be asked.
- 3.4 The pass mark for the test is 85% both for the Highland-wide section of the test and the local area section.

4. Request that the Committee lower the pass mark

- 4.1 The Licensing Committee's Taxi/PHC Sub Group recently met with taxi and PHC operators in Highland at a series of meetings held in Dingwall, Fort William, Inverness and Wick. The purpose of these meetings was primarily to consult the operators on the next taxi tariff review, but also to allow operators who attended to raise any other matters relating to taxis and PHCs which they wished the Council to look into.
- 4.2 During the Sub Group meeting in Wick on 23 April 2018, the three operators who attended raised as one such matter the 85% pass mark for the Highland-wide section of the taxi driver's knowledge test. They advised that this was unnecessarily high given that nowadays most vehicles were fitted with satellite navigation devices and most drivers used these, particularly for the purpose of knowing ahead whether there were any road works or accidents which might affect the choice of route they take.
- 4.3 The operators at the Wick meeting also advised that this 85% pass mark was a disincentive to persons who might otherwise wish to apply for a taxi driver's licence and were only likely to be driving in their local area anyway. This in turn created difficulty for operators wishing to recruit new drivers. They accordingly requested that the Committee consider lowering the pass mark for the Highland-wide section of the test. Suggestions as to what it should be lowered to varied, though 60% or 75% were both mentioned.
- 4.4 The Committee members present at the Sub Group meeting agreed that this request would be relayed to the full Committee for consideration at their next meeting. They asked officers to provide in advance of this meeting an indication of failure rates and percentages, both for the Highland-wide section and the local area section of the test. These have now been collated for the period from 1 January 2018 to 30 April 2018 and are attached at **Appendix 2**.
