### 1.0 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 To inform the Planning Applications Committee of the submission of the attached Proposal of Application Notice (PAN).

#### 2.0 SITE DESCRIPTION

The site extends over a vast area of land and is located approximately 4km southeast of Lairg. It consists principally of rough agricultural land and marshy grassland. There are a number of water courses on the site, and the land rises towards the northeast. Loch Cracail Mor, lies to the southeast of the site boundary. There are 3 x 100m to tip turbines which are existing and located to the north of the site. The A836 public road runs approximately 1km to the west of the western edge of the site. The site is not covered by any natural heritage or landscape designations.
