1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 To inform the Planning Applications Committee of the submission of the attached Proposal of Application Notice (PAN).
- 1.2 The submission of the PAN accords with the provisions of the Planning etc. (Scotland) Act 2006 and was lodged on the 29 August 2018. Members are asked to note this may form the basis of a subsequent planning application

2. DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

2.1 The proposed development is for the construction of a residual waste management facility on the site of the former landfill site. The development will consist of a building for use as a waste transfer station for mixed recyclate and also for residual domestic waste. The transfer station will process the waste into refuse derived fuel (RDF) bales. In addition the development will consist of access roads, car parking, weigh bridge, welfare facilities, drainage and site utilities.

3. SITE DESCRIPTION

- 3.1 The site is the former Longman landfill that lies immediately to the east of the A9 at the Longman roundabout junction. The landfill has extensive tree coverage but is more exposed and open towards the Inner Moray Firth.
- 3.2 Access to the site will be taken from the existing Stadium Road.
