Report Title: Early Learning and Childcare Update

Report By: Director of Care and Learning

## **Purpose/Executive Summary**

- 1.1 This report provides members with an update on the developments within the expansion of Early Learning and Childcare (ELC). It also offers a summary of the progress of the current sites who are delivering 1140 hours.
- 1.2 Within the report there is also an outline of the capital programme requirements in relation to the expansion.

### 2. Recommendations

#### 3. Introduction

- 3.1 High quality Early Learning and Childcare is an entitlement for all children and is crucial to ensure that the aspirations of the government to reduce the poverty related attainment gap is actioned at the earliest stages through high quality pedagogy.
- 3.2 To effectively support children, we require a skilled and knowledgeable ELC workforce who are supported through strong inspirational leadership and by staff who truly understand child development and the impact that poor attachment and ineffective transitions can have on children's wellbeing and ability to learn and succeed.
- 3.3 Since the last report to this committee in May 2018, the full funding of the expansion plan, as detailed in the financial templates submitted to the Scottish Government in March 2018, has allowed us to progress on the required elements to ensure Highland Council is able to successfully deliver on the expansion of ELC.
- 3.4 Although the first year of funding did not allow us to offer every child in Highland an increase in hours from this year to 760, it has allowed us to move forward with pilot sites to deliver 1140 hours, and to evaluate and consider all of the learning as we move forward into next year.

### 4. Scottish Government Expansion Programme

- 4.1 The Government has established a new Directorate for Early Learning and Childcare, with Joe Griffin as Director leading this programme of transformational change. Mr Griffin visited services in Lochaber at the commencement of his appointment.
- 4.2 A new ELC Programme Joint Delivery Board will be co-chaired by Maree Todd, the Minister for Children and Young People, and Cllr Stephen McCabe, COSLA spokesperson on children and young people. The Delivery Board will review and monitor progress towards the implementation of 1140 hours across all 32 authorities through a set of indicators that will be used to provide evidence based analysis of progress.
- 4.3 The Delivery Board will be supported by a Steering Group, involving a senior lead officer from each of the Regional Improvement Collaboratives. There will also be a new Partnership Forum, where the Northern Alliance will be represented by a lead ELC officer.
- 4.4 Specific data that will be collected from authorities will be gathered through a Dashboard that will capture, track and monitor progress to ensure that local plans are delivered timeously, and any risks or threats addressed.
- 4.5 Work is ongoing on the transformation of the ELC census with SEEMis, ScotXed and local authorities working together to find solutions to staff data requirements. This is a substantial piece of local administrative work that takes place in each authority every year and any streamlining of this is welcomed.
- 4.6 The Scottish Government has also committed to full funding of a new management information system, which will transform our capacity to manage ELC processes.
- 4.7 We are awaiting the publication of the National Standard, which will detail the requirements for local authority and partners to deliver ELC. The premise for this will be

based on evidence to support a high quality provision that includes gradings from the Care Inspectorate and Education Scotland and a provider neutral approach.

4.8 The National Standard will detail amongst other things how funding will follow the child, and set out criteria such as: how we support children with additional support needs; catering requirements; workforce qualification and learning requirements; outdoor learning; and how the principles of ELC are to be delivered in every setting. Technical guidance to assist local authorities to undertake this function is being developed alongside the National Standard, and Scotland Excel has been commissioned to take this forward.

### 5. Local Delivery Plan

- 5.1 The philosophy for the delivery of ELC in Highland continues to be strong, with the needs of children at the forefront of the expansion programme. Early Years Education and Support Officers, exercising the peripatetic teacher function, are well placed to help maintain and improve the quality of provision through the period of change. As reported previously, expansion poses a range of challenges to maintaining the quality of provision but also opportunities to bring about step changes in improvement, including in provision for children with additional support needs. We will need to ensure that there is sufficient strategic capacity to bring about necessary improvement and ensure equity of quality provision around Highland, and continuity of pedagogy through Early Level curriculum.
- 5.2 Continuous professional learning and training remains a priority, and is being refined and adjusted to meet the needs of the growing workforce. A career structure in ELC is beginning to take shape through the introduction of the modern apprentice, support worker and senior practitioner roles. With the national focus on the ELC workforce and qualification requirements, we are well placed to continue to shape and deliver a workforce for the future, albeit there are continuing concerns about the provision of Gaelic medium practitioners at all levels.
- 5.3 We are working closely with the Learning and Development team in Highland Council, and have provided placements and mentoring for 5 ELC modern apprentices in local authority settings with plans to introduce many more next year. We need to be able to offer assessors to the modern apprentices, and are encouraging current ELC practitioners to consider this role as part of their own career progression. We are currently looking to support the assessor role in each of the 4 areas of Highland, and are keen for one of those assessors to be a Gaelic speaker.
- 5.4 The 6 additional graduates that Highland was tasked to employ in areas of deprivation have been appointed. The Government has funded these posts across Scotland, in order to address the poverty related attainment gap, and the impact of the posts including the outcomes for children will be closely monitored. An induction programme has been developed, with an expectation that the graduates provide strong leadership and strengthen early years pedagogy in the nurseries where they are placed, and influence wider practice in all ELC settings.
- 5.5 The graduates have been appointed to:
  - Newton Park, Wick
  - Lundavra, Fort William
  - Millbank, Nairn
  - Merkinch Family Centre, Inverness

- Hilton, Inverness
- Park and South Lodge, shared post
- 5.6 The Northern Alliance is working together to ensure that where the graduate posts are introduced, the impact on the outcomes for children is measured, shared and developed to inform best practice across all settings.
- 5.7 Highland Council is one of the 8 local authorities selected to work with Inspiring Scotland to develop outdoor learning. The benefits of being outdoors cannot be overstated, and an opportunity for children to learn through play in nature is something we want to embrace. We have had several meetings with Inspiring Scotland and discussed potential sites, including some that are fully outdoors, free flow (in and out), and satellite provision.
- 5.8 We already have settings that offer a full outdoor experience in Highland and others that take children to woodland and outside areas within local communities, with many opportunities to explore further and expand on this. Another exciting opportunity we are exploring is an outdoor provision for children in the grounds of a day care centre for older people in Inverness. This intergenerational approach is still at the planning stages, but is generating a lot of excitement around the huge benefits that this could offer.
- 5.9 Enabling outdoor learning does however require a workforce that is willing to provide the enhanced skills and mind-set that often involves a shift in culture, to enable the best outdoor experience for children. With this in mind, we are having discussions with one of our partner providers that already possess a wealth of knowledge and experience around outdoor learning, about training staff who want to drive this forward.
- 5.10 As Members will appreciate, in order to satisfy the government that we are delivering this programme of change requires that any planning, monitoring, tracking, data gathering and financial reporting back to the government is becoming more complex and more detailed. This is not without its challenges in an early years' service that is primarily concerned with ensuring that 1140 hours of high quality ELC is provided to all children across Highland in a short period of time.
- 5.11 The risks to implementation are being managed by a committed workforce who are tackling the challenges where they arise and who are solution focused in their approach. However, enabling flexibility of provision has not been without its difficulties and refinement of the arrangements to provide this requires adjustments and procedures to be put in place. Staff should not be distracted by the systems and processes required to provide this programme of transformational change and should be offered the assurance that our priority is to address any of the business side of the expansion that is getting in the way of us delivering the entitlement.
- 5.12 As costed in our Delivery Plan the requirement for a business officer to ensure we have the expertise within the team required for setting up, monitoring and streamlining systems and assisting in the operational provision of an effective and efficient business that supports the requirements of the programme is now being progressed.
- 5.13 **Appendix 1** lists the Highland Council settings where capital investment has been confirmed as being necessary at this stage, in line with the projections and costings in the initial plan submitted to Government. The Appendix identifies projects that have been completed or are currently underway, along with particular issues at some settings. Additional internal resources will be required within the Estates Team and the

delivery teams within Development and Infrastructure, in order to have all of the necessary extra accommodation and improvements in place by August 2020.

- 5.14 It is intended that a significant number of the capital projects will be procured through existing framework contracts that allow the early engagement of contractors to work alongside the Council project teams. This will reduce the procurement lead-in times and will also help to establish a consistent approach across batches of similar projects. Traditional tendering methods will also be used where considered appropriate, particularly in areas of Highland where local contractors may be better placed to deliver best value.
- 5.15 It is intended that regular updates will be provided to Members on the investment programme (using an expanded template similar to Appendix 1) by the Estates team and/or Area Care and Learning Managers via Ward Business Meetings, commencing in November 2018.

### 6. 1140 hours implementation

- 6.1 After consultation with Members and managers, six settings were identified to take forward the offer of 1140 hours in 2018/18. This was based on socioeconomic and SIMD indicators of disadvantage, child poverty data and free school meal entitlement. The implementation of this offer to parents commenced in August 2018, at the following locations:
  - Bun-Sgoil Ghàidhlig Loch Abar
  - Flipperz Day Care Centre, Merkinch
  - Kyle Primary School
  - Merkinch Family Centre
  - Merkinch Primary School
  - Obsdale Primary School
- 6.2 Whilst planning for this over the summer, it was identified that there could be a negative impact on one of our partner providers, where parents might withdraw their children from existing placements, in favour of the enhanced provision elsewhere. This was mitigated by children who were on a split placement between two settings in Fort William being included in the 1140 hours offer.
- 6.3 Project teams have been established in each of the four localities Kyle, Alness, Fort William and Merkinch. Membership comprises of staff that support each of the settings including the head teacher or manager, together with the ELC project manager. The uptake of the full 1140 hours across all settings is currently around 65%, which is an increase in the initial forecast of 45% before the school holidays. The expectation is that this will rise as more families choose to benefit from the offer.
- 6.4 Catering is an issue that has required a great deal of planning, and this has included discussion around dining facilities and staffing, meal times, food choices and wastage as eligible 2, 3 and 4 year olds are now on site all day. This will be amplified in 2020, therefore learning acquired now will be essential for forward planning.
- 6.5 The project teams have worked hard to ensure sites were ready at the start of the summer term and should be commended for their positive and collaborative approach. As they evolve over the months to come, the next stage will be to share practice across Highland via regular communication and expansion workshops and to work with area

teams to determine the sites that will deliver 1140 hours from August 2019.

## 7. Implications

### 7.1 Resource

The Government has awarded full capital and revenue funding for 1140 hours, based on Highland Council's plan. There is a challenge to ensure all capital funding is utilised in time.

The requirement to provide 1140 hours to eligible children is part of the Children & Young People (Scotland) Act 2014
