# 3. Grants and Capital Projects

- 3.1 The current summary of funds available following the Inverness Common Good Fund Sub-Committee meeting on 28 January 2019 is set out in **Appendix 1**.
- 3.2 **Booklet A** includes details of current grant applications for more than £10,000. Members are invited to consider the following applications:
  - Loch Ness Knit Fest: The Inverness Common Good Fund Sub-Committee recommend approval of a grant of £15,000 (£7,500 from the Grants Budget and £7,500 from the Conference Support Budget) towards the Loch Ness Knit Fest 2019. If approved this will come from the 2019/20 Grants/Conference Support Budgets

# Capital Projects Funded by Inverness Common Good Fund

### 1 General

1.1 This appendix provides project status information for current key capital projects funded by the Inverness Common Good Fund, including financial progress details, as of 6 February 2019.

## 2 Capital Programme Update

2.1 The current status of each individual project is summarised below.

# 2.2 **Conservation of External Fabric Phase 2, Town House, Inverness**

2.2.1 The external works contract was completed on the 10 November 2017 and the internal refurbishment and lighting works was completed 9 February 2018. The defects period will end on the 10 February 2019.

It should be noted that through cost savings and careful management of resources throughout the contract we have managed to pay for the three additional items at a cost of £150,800 mentioned in previous committee reports within the existing budget.

The final account has been agreed.

# 2.4 Conservation of External Fabric Phase 3, Town House, Inverness

2.4.1 Acceptance letter issued on the 23 July 2018. Work commenced on site on 10 September 2018 and the completion date for is 11 September 2020.

Works are progressing well and on programme.

Decant arrangements have been agreed and the first 22 staff members have been decanted for a six month period.

# 2.5 Victorian Market, Academy Street Entrance Upgrade

2.5.1 It has been agreed that the stonework repairs to the front façade will be undertaken first. The replacement of the inner doors has come in over budget and an alternative scheme is being investigated and will be reported to a future Committee. A third party grant for £31,000.00 from the Academy Street Project has been awarded. This means the total outlay for the Inverness Common Good Fund will be  $\pounds$ 12,000.00.

The Stonework repairs will commence on site at the end of March and will take approximately eight weeks to complete.

# 2.6 Civic Floor Male Toilet Refurbishment, Inverness Town House

2.6.1 Refurbishment drawings and tender documentation has been completed, tender costs are currently being arranged. Once costs have been agreed discussions with Civic Officer will be held to arrange an appropriate time for the works to take place as the toilets will be out of use for a period of four to six weeks.

#### 3. Governance

3.1 These projects are funded by the Inverness Common Good Fund and monthly Contract Monitoring reports will be issued to the Inverness City Area Manager, in line with governance arrangements.
