Report Title: Decriminalised Parking Enforcement Update

Purpose/Executive Summary

1.1 To update members on the timetable for the implementation of full decriminalised parking enforcement in Ross and Cromarty.

2 Recommendations

2.1 Members are asked to note the update on the rollout of Decriminalised Parking Enforcement (DPE) to Ross and Cromarty.

3 Work done to date

- 3.1 All relevant Traffic Regulation Orders have been published and consultation completed for waiting and loading restrictions in Alness, Dingwall, Invergordon, Kyle of Lochalsh, Tain and Ullapool.
- 3.2 After initial objections to the introduction of some changes in Invergordon proposals were revised to replicate the status quo.
- 3.3 Some minor alterations were made to Alness to better clarify Disabled Bays.
- 3.4 There are no outstanding objections to the proposals

4 Enforcement

- 4.1 At the time of writing, the TRO is scheduled to go live on the 14th May 2019.
- 4.2 Officers will begin attending these towns during May recording any lining or signing work that is outstanding
- 4.3 Officers will initially issue warning notices to ensure that drivers are aware of the new enforcement activity but will begin live enforcement during May.

5 Next Steps

- 5.1 Instruct works to refresh any outstanding lining requirements and replace any signs that are required.
- 5.2 Sept 2019 Advertise Traffic Regulation Orders for next phase of sites Avoch, Fortrose, Gairloch, Rosemarkie, Muir of Ord, Munlochy and any other minor restrictions.
