1. Purpose/Executive Summary

4. Quarter 1 Monitoring Statement

- 4.1 A monitoring statement showing transactions to the end of June 2019 against budget and estimated year end position is attached at **Appendix One.**
- Income Income received from rental properties to date is £2,637. The income to Fortrose and Rosemarkie Common Good Fund is derived from Fortrose Town Hall and King George V Park which are leased to The Highland Council and rented to High Life Highland (rent review undertaken April 2019), Fortrose Bay Caravan Site (rent review undertaken 1 June 2019), Rosemarkie Caravan Site and Car Park at Golf Club. When the income budget was set rents totalled £13,022. Following rent review the total anticipated income from these properties for 2019/20 is £13,797. The budget and estimated outturn has been amended to reflect this.
- 4.3 **Expenditure** Expenditure of £242 relating to property costs has been incurred in Quarter 1.
