	MD reported that there had been no response to the notice of this meeting, or that of the 23 Oct 2018, from Traylan Peat (Caithness Disability Access Panel). MD to check emails have been received by Traylan	MD
2.	Welcome and Introductions KR welcomed everyone to the meeting and introductions were made around the table.	
	WB gave a brief outline of his connection to the Forum - was a member of the "old" Forum with various interests which include canoeing, mountain biking, cycling, walking, field studies, bird surveys etc	
3.	 Appointment of Chair and Vice-Chair Chair - KR was nominated by JW, seconded by BM, Vice-Chair - JW was nominated by BMG, seconded by BM, no other nominations received No other Forum members wished to be considered for either of the above posts and were in agreement with both proposals 	

4. Notes from meeting - 23 October 2018 Agreed

Matters Arising:

Constitution

Still same concern as noted at the last meeting - as the Forum is under the Highland Council - only a Chair and a Vice-Chair are required. Agreed that as communication is taking place via emails (list was previously sent out in October 2018) possibly no need to go further to progress the change in the Constitution. However, may come back to at a later date if it proves difficult to hold the meetings if both the Chair and Vice-Chair call off at short notice

Halkirk to Sibster Path:

(First raised: *pre 09/17*, Date Closed: *ongoing*, Ownership: *KR*) Being addressed but will take time

Jessan's Bridge / Burn of Garth:

(First raised: *Pre 09/17*, Date Closed: 14/01/18, Ownership: *MD/Cllr Mackie*)

MD has passed on the information to Cllr Struan Mackie and to the Chair of Castletown Community Council. Forum agreed to close.

Scrabster to Quarry Path:

(First raised: Pre 09/17, Date Closed: ongoing, Ownership: MD)

- MD has spoken with Steven Blackwood gate ready to go in
- Put forward the option of Highland Council buying the gate as their contribution. With the current and possibly ongoing financial constraints this is not now possible
- Gate has been locked since 19 years ago, most people climb over the fence but this is not so easy for people with pushchairs, mountain bikes etc

Braemore:

(First raised: Pre 09/17, Date Closed: 14/01/19, Ownership: JW)

- JW has spoken with/emailed Anson MacAuslan, Estate Manager as to what the Plan was
- Estate Manager has no plan to apply retrospectively for planning permission
- Forum has noted that Planning Permission would be the correct way forward.
- As cannot change the plan at present, noted that there have been no complaints to date regarding the change of path, the Plan will be amended at an appropriate time
- The change to the Path was carried out without consultation with the Forum or Highland Council
- JW said that in respect of the JOG Trail, the Estate have been very easy to work with - 8 miles of the trail goes through the Estate
- Recommendation by the Forum is to change the Plan.

Action: New route is considered as at future review of the plan. MD **Coastal Path East of John O'Groats** (First raised: Pre 09/17, Date Closed: ongoing, Ownership: BM) BM has been liaising with Leona Joiner, Tourism Project Coordinator, Highland Council who has taken up the case alongside the John O'Groat Development Trust who will apply to the Rural Tourism Infrastructure Fund Money for maintenance to be included in the budget, if at all possible KR recently walked the route and it was being well used Development Trust have employed someone to look after the Highlighting that the path runs through the Caravan Park might affect funding The local community census is that they would like to move the path in the Plan KR Agreed that KR to keep in touch with the JOG Development Trust and feed back to the Forum at next meeting Submissions to this fund have to be submitted by end of January MD 2019, check with HC staff if this project is being supported. John O'Groats Trail (JOGT) (First raised: Pre 09/17, Date Closed: ongoing ad hoc, Ownership: JW) Trail Ranger out on the trail £50k funding received will keep the trail open this coming year Alongside volunteers the overgrown undergrowth is being removed Local businesses have advised/noted increased bookings boosting the local economy Within the year there will be the Cicerone guidebook on the shelves in shops/Amazon Forum agreed to raise the Trail under Any Other Current Business as and when required but if to be a main agenda item via MD before the agenda is due to be distributed (minimum notice 8 days before meeting) Sandside Estate (First raised: 09/02/17, Date Closed: ongoing, Ownership: MD) KR did meet with the Estate owner but considered it not the appropriate time to bring up this concern due to another matter raised

5. The Highland Council Core Paths Plan - Caithness & Sutherland - Amended

Following on from Matters Arising, further discussions took place regarding the Coastal Path East of JOG

- MD alluded to keeping the route through the Caravan Park in the Amended Plan with the 5 objections outstanding
- Not suitable to have it running through the Caravan Park and to return to the Shore Path - JOG Development Trust taking forward
- Caravan Park shut over the Winter months
- A coastal path is far more beneficial to tourism and the locals
- JOGT Path has been marked working alongside the landowner, unfortunately it does not make the campsite happy
- Landowner would welcome a change to the Core Path
- Do not want to upset the landowner more than we have to
- Felt tourists want better attractions alongside easy access to the coastal path eg café, toilets, information etc
- The development trust have put in an expression of interest for the Rural Tourism Infrastructure Fund which need to be followed up by application at end of this month
- More resources of funding, possibly Sustrans/Commuity Links who will match funding
- Unknown if stage 2 submission will be made to RTIF MD to follow up.
- Still need to have a lease with the landowner as HC will not engage without a lease
- Tourists/walkers etc want to end their walk at JOG not on a caravan site
- Could the landowners boundary fence be changed, however this has not been discussed with them

Agreed that the Core Path Plan route to remain through the caravan park with working towards a community driven solution backed by the Forum

Forum voted on taking the CPP to the next Area Committee - vote was 4 for, 2 against, so will be taken forward

Swiney Hill

- One objection due to the path ending at a ditch
- Core Path needs to end somewhere more acceptable so agreed to ending Achactle and links core paths
- Oil/gas installation in situ is relatively hidden by the slope inland, does not affect the proposal
- Small ditch which is not an issue to cross
- Not heard from the landowners or the crofters regarding the modifying of the Plan

MD

Altnabreac Crossing

- MD gave a brief update on the background route was previously in the core paths plan and was objected to by Network Rail. Matter went through PLI and reporter recommended inclusion of the route but Scottish Ministers decided not to include due to Law commission report that had just been started. Report now published and whilst no new legislation has come from the report none is needed for the Council to re-designate route as a core path which has triggered objection from Network Rail.
- Previously there was a site visit with Police Transport along with previous members of the Forum - the Police were very adamant and giving nothing at all
- Trains do slow down for the station to see if any passengers are wishing to board
- Noted that there is very little flexibility but if the path is in situ before the track goes in, classed as Public Level Crossing. If it goes in after the track is in situ it is a Private Level Crossing which is the case at Altnabreac
- Most crossings now have a telephone nearby any doubt about the train timetable; advice would be to use the telephone to enquire.
- Path is well signposted at either end of the route
- The gravel track in Strathmore forest has been upgraded so that lorries can travel on it but this makes cycling a problem
- Promoted in 2001 2004 for roads to be put in for Flow Country
