1. Purpose/Executive Summary

1.1 Description: Slickly Wind Farm - consisting of up to 11 turbines up to 149.9m to

tip height and up to 49.9mw generation capacity

1.2 **Ward:** 03 - Wick and East Caithness

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 To inform the Planning Applications Committee of the submission of the attached Proposal of Application Notice (PAN).
- 3.2 The submission of the PAN accords with the provisions of the Planning etc. (Scotland) Act 2006 and was lodged on 05 July 2019 and made valid on 05 July 2019. Members are asked to note this may form the basis of a subsequent planning application
- 3.3 The submitted information attached includes:
 - Proposal of Application Notice
 - Location Plan
 - Details of public events

4. DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

- 4.1 The PAN provides notice of the developer's intention to submit a planning application for a proposed wind farm (known as Slickly Wind Farm). The wind farm would comprise of the following infrastructure and has the potential to generate up to 49.9MW of electricity:
 - 11 wind turbines, with a maximum height to blade tip of 149.9m;
 - Access tracks;
 - Turbine foundations and transformer plinths and enclosures;
 - Electrical substation' underground power cable;
 - Permanent meteorological mast; and
 - Temporary site construction compound.

5. SITE DESCRIPTION

- 5.1 The site lies approximately 14km north west of Wick and approximately 18.2km east of Thurso. The site extends to approximately 316 hectares, although the built development will occupy a much smaller area. The turbines will be set on a site which is predominantly coniferous forestry but also comprises sweeping moorland. The highest point on the site is approximately 60m AOD with some parts of the site dropping down to approximately 35m AOD.
- 5.2 The site will likely be accessed from C1037 Lyth to Gills Road. The delivery of abnormal loads is likely to be via Wick Harbour.
- 5.3 There are a number of sites designated for natural heritage interests in the wider area. The closest designated site is the Caithness and Sutherland Peatlands Special Protection Area / Special Area of Conservation / Ramsar site and its composite Sites of Special Scientific Interest. This bounds the site to the north and south

- 5.4 There are a number of scheduled monuments in the wider area but none on the site. Further there are a number of listed buildings and archaeological records, identified within the Highland Historic Environment Record, which exist within and in proximity to the site.
- 5.5 The site contains a number of watercourses which feed into the Back Burn of Slickly.
- 5.6 The site sits within the Sweeping Moorland and Flows Landscape Character Type but is not located within any international or regional landscape designations.

Other Consultation Methods (dates, time and with whom)

The Applicant has employed various other consultation methods including establishing a Community Liaison Group (CLG) and using a mail drop to advertise the public exhibitions.

CLG

A Community Liaison Group (CLG) established on 8th October 2018 with representatives from Dunnet & Canisbay Community Council (CC), Bower CC, Sinclairs Bay CC and Castletown CC invited to attend a meeting in the Seaview Hotel, John O'Groats KW1 4YR. Seven representatives attended from Dunnet & Canisbay CC, Sinclairs Bay CC and Castletown CC. A representative from Foundation Scotland also attended to provide further information to the CCs on the administration of the proposed community benefit fund.

A further CLG was held on 24th June 2019 at the Seaview Hotel, John O'Groats KW1 4YR at 6.30pm with representatives from the above CCs invited. Ten representatives attended from Dunnet & Canisbay and Sinclairs Bay CCs. A representative from Caithness Broch Project also attended the meeting.

Further CLGs are proposed to be undertaken on Tuesday 3rd September 2019 at 7.30 pm and/or Monday 11th November 2019 depending on the level of update required for the CCs.

Mail Drop

To advertise the first public event in November 2018, a newsletter was posted to 1,492 addresses (all properties within a 10 km radius of the Site) to inform residents of the Development and the times and locations for the public events.

It is proposed that a similar newsletter will issued to all addresses within a 10 km radius of the Site prior to the scheduled public event in November 2019.
