Purpose/Executive Summary

- 1.1 The Caithness Educational Trust Scheme 1973 was created from endowments already vested in the Caithness County Council by the earlier scheme of 1936 and additional endowments named in schedule 1 to the 1973 Scheme. These additional endowments were vested in the County Council.
- 1.2 There are also 3 endowments where it was provided that annual income would be paid into the Scheme, but they were to remain vested in their original Trustees. These were:
 - Kirk's Mortification taken over by Caithness District Council
 - Hallawall's Bequest
 - Swarclett Fund

Recommendations

- 2.1 Members are asked to:
 - i. **Note** that many of the descriptors of the prize criteria are old fashioned and of their time. In our diverse society It is not in the interests of our children and young people to have prizes awarded to others on the basis of educational attainment. It is recommended that Members **agree** the funds that are noted in Appendix 1, schedule 3,4 and 5 are allocated to the school and that the head teacher uses this for the benefit of any/all pupils;
 - ii. **Agree** that a process is set up to automatically issue these funds in April of each financial year which will provide clarity around the remaining budget for the coming year;
 - iii. **Agree** that an application window be applied and that based on available funds and received applications we allocate the amount set aside for the year on that basis. This will require some advertising on the council website and by other means to encourage applications at a certain time;

- iv. **Agree** the amount set aside for bursary payments is agreed by the Committee at the beginning of the financial year with data available to inform decision making; and
- v. **Agree** the sum allocated in each year provides opportunity and fairness with new applicants receiving priority over returning applicants, with a new maximum being set per person.

3 Implications

- 3.1 Resource This will enable the trust to be managed more efficiently and effectively with clear guidance and criteria bring applied. It will also bring some fairness to the way the fund is being disaggregated.
- 3.2 Legal There are no legal implications as we are acting within the bounds of the trust with some minor modernisation.
- 3.3 Community (Equality, Poverty and Rural) As above I think these minor alterations will allow for fairer distribution of funds to those most in need.
- 3.4 Climate Change / Carbon Clever There are no implications
- 3.5 Risk There are no risk implications arising from this report.
- 3.6 Gaelic There are no Gaelic implications.

4 Report

- 4.1 The purposes of the 1973 Scheme are as follows:
 - Make the special payments stated in Schedule 3 to the 1973 Scheme figures to be paid are specified.
 - Pay the bursaries and prizes stated namely: Rhind Bursaries, bursaries listed in Schedule 4 and the prizes listed in Schedule 5 to the 1973 Scheme figures to be paid are specified.
 - Any income remaining after the above can be applied in accordance with the approved plan.
 - The order that the income must be applied in is as stated above first special payments, second bursaries and prizes then third income plan items. **See Appendix 1.**
- 4.2 The figures for the various awards were set in 1973 and do not appear to have been formally updated since. Attached is a spreadsheet that has applied an indexed linked calculation to place a current monetary value for the awards specified. **Appendix 1** columns D and E.
- 4.3 The type of awards that can be included in the income plan are contained in Schedule 6 to the 1973 Scheme. Some or all can be included. The Council must allocate a maximum sum it would propose to spend in any financial year. The total of all proposed sums in the income plan should exceed the estimated free income by not less than 15% and not more than 25% of the estimated free income. Members are advised that:-

- 1. The Trust previously owned Rhind House from which it derived rental income. However, this property was sold in January 2018 for £90,000. These funds are currently held as a capital receipt in respect of the Scheme.
- 2. The capital of the trust at the end of 2018-19 financial year was £317,737.
- 3. The income received by the trust in 2018-19 financial year was £2,471.
- 4. The expenditure from the trust was £5,819.
- 5. Details of the most recent expenditure from April 2019 to date are attached. Appendix 2.
- 6. The 1973 Scheme needs to be brought up to date and actively promoted to ensure that those that should be benefitting are afforded the opportunity to do so.
