1. Purpose/Executive Summary

1.1 Description: Stemster Wind Farm - Up to 13 wind turbine generators of up to

175 meter tip height, with a capacity not exceeding 49 mw

1.2 Ward: 03 – Wick and East Caithness

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 To inform the Planning Applications Committee of the submission of the attached Proposal of Application Notice (PAN).
- 3.2 The submission of the PAN accords with the provisions of the Planning etc. (Scotland) Act 2006 and was lodged and made valid on 29 January 2020. Members are asked to note this may form the basis of a subsequent planning application.
- 3.3 The submitted information attached includes:
 - Proposal of Application Notice
 - Location Plan
 - Site Layout Plan

4. DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

- 4.1 The PAN provides notice of the developer's intention to submit a planning application for a proposed wind farm (known as Stemster Wind Farm). The wind farm would likely comprise of the following infrastructure and has the potential to generate up to 49MW of electricity:
 - Up to 13 wind turbines, with a maximum height to blade tip of 175m;
 - Access tracks; and
 - Turbine foundations and transformer plinths and enclosures.

5. SITE DESCRIPTION

- 5.1 The proposed development site forms approximately 650 hectares. The site comprises an area of undulating but generally rising ground to the north, south and west of Stemster Hill. The site access would be from the A9 trunk road and then the local road network. The site is bounded by commercial forestry to the east.
- The site is located approximately 6.3km north of Latheron, 18km south west of Wick and 24km south of Thurso. The immediate areas surrounding the turbine envelope is sparsely populated. The site is located adjacent to the A9 trunk road.

- 5.5 There are a number of watercourses present within and adjacent to the site. The most notable is Loch Stemster.
- 5.6 The site sits within the Sweeping Moorland and Flows Landscape Character Type. The Causeymire Knockfin Flows Wild Land Area is located directly to the west of the site.




