Application for the provisional grant of a premises licence under the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005

Edinburgh Woollen Mill, 5 Bridge Street, Inverness, IV1 1HG

Report by the Clerk to the Licensing Board

#### Summary

This report relates to an application for the provisional grant of a premises licence in respect of Edinburgh Woollen Mill, 5 Bridge Street, Inverness, IV1 1HG.

### 1.0 Description of premises

1.1 The Edinburgh Woollen Mill is situated in Inverness City Centre and consists of a large store on one level.

### 2.0 Operating hours

2.1 The applicant seeks the following **off-sale** hours:

#### Off sales:

Monday to Sunday: 1000 hours to 2200 hours

### 3.0 Background

3.1 On 10 February 2020 the Licensing Board received an application for the provisional grant of a premises licence from The Edinburgh Woollen Mill Limited.

The application was accompanied by the necessary section 50 certification in terms of Planning, together with a Disabled Access Statement.

- 3.2 The application was publicised during the period 17 February until 9 March 2020 and confirmation that the site notice was displayed has been received.
- 3.3 In accordance with standard procedure, Police Scotland, the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service and the Council's Community Services (Environmental Health) and Planning and Building Standards were consulted on the application.
- 3.4 Notification of the application was also sent to NHS Highland and the local Community Council.

- 3.5 Further to this publication and consultation process, no timeous objections or representations have been received.
- 3.6 The applicant must nevertheless be given the opportunity to be heard before the Board determines the application and has accordingly been invited to the meeting. The applicant has been advised of the hearings procedure which may also be viewed via the following link:

### 4.0 Legislation

4.1 The Licensing Board must, in considering and determining the application, consider whether any grounds of refusal apply and, if none of them applies, the Board must grant the application.

Relevant grounds of refusal are: -

- 1. that the premises are excluded premises;
- 2. that the Board considers, having regard to the licensing objectives, that the applicant is not a fit and proper person to be the holder of a premises licence;
- 3. that the grant of the application would be inconsistent with one or more of the licensing objectives;
- 4. that having regard to;
  - (i) the nature of the activities proposed to be carried on in the subject premises,
  - (ii) the location character and condition of the premises, and
  - (iii) the persons likely to frequent the premises,
  - the Board considers the premises are unsuitable for use for the sale of alcohol, or
- 5. that the Board considers that, if the application were to be granted, there would, as a result, be overprovision of licensed premises, or licensed premises of the same or similar description as the subject premises, in the locality.
- 4.2 For the purposes of the Act, the licensing objectives are-
  - (a) preventing crime and disorder,
  - (b) securing public safety,
  - (c) preventing public nuisance,
  - (d) protecting and improving public health, and
  - (e) protecting children and young persons from harm.

4.3 If the Board would refuse the application as made, but a modification is proposed by them and accepted by the applicant, the application can be granted as so modified.

### 5.0 Licensing Standards Officer

- 5.1 The LSO has provided the following comments:-
  - (i) An application has been received via agents acting on behalf of the applicants, Edinburgh Woollen Mill for a provisional alcohol premises licence for a new store situated at 5 Bridge Street, Inverness.
  - (ii) The application has been submitted with the necessary Section 50 certificate in respect of planning. The disabled access statement together with layout plans of acceptable quality have also been submitted.
  - (iii) The application contains opening hours for off sales in accordance with those allowed by the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005. The LSO is of the opinion that the operating plan submitted is in accordance with the 5 licensing objectives.
  - (iv) The off sales display area is within the 40 square metre capacity, which would trigger consideration by the Board, in respect of the issue of over provision. The range of alcohol which will be stocked will be superior malt whiskies, gins and liquors which will appeal to the tourist market. The shop with its quality branded Scottish merchandise is very much aimed at the visitor market as the area in which the premises are situated has a great proportion of tourist footfall.
  - (v) Edinburgh Woollen Mills have several shops of similar operation in the Highland area, all are well run with strong levels of staff training and diligence.
  - (vi) Following the public consultation phase of this application, no objections or observations have been received on behalf of the Board.

#### 7.0 Conditions

#### 7.1 Mandatory conditions
