 - 1. Inshes Community Association: The Inverness Common Good Fund Sub-Committee recommend deferral of this application for submission of further information.
 - 2. Wasps Trust: The Inverness Common Good Fund Sub-Committee recommend approval of a grant of £65,000 towards Phase 2 of the Inverness Creative Academy.
 - 3. Inverness Rotary Club: The Inverness Common Good Fund Sub-Committee recommend approval of £16,900 towards the Rotary Centenary Bed at the Raigmore Interchange Roundabout in 2021 from the Commemorative Bedding Budget, which has a balance of £11,000. Noting that there is anticipated expenditure of £3,000, it is proposed to take the balance required to meet the cost from the City Promotions Budget.
