1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 To inform the Planning Applications Committee of the submission of the attached Proposal of Application Notice (PAN).
- 1.2 The submission of the PAN accords with the provisions of the Planning etc. (Scotland) Act 2006 and was lodged on 17th July 2020. Members are asked to note this may form the basis of a subsequent planning application

The applicant has set out that their consultation event took place on 25th August 2020 between 3pm-7pm and was an online meeting and presentation with a Q & A Session on the company's website. It was advertised in the Inverness Courier.

2. DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

- 2.1 Based upon the information provided, the development is likely to comprise of 30MW battery energy storage system comprising steel containers, GRP substation, fencing, tree planting and associated works.
- 2.2 The applicant has not sought pre-application advice from the Planning Authority via the Pre-Application Advice Service for Major Developments in advance of submission of the PAN.

3. SITE DESCRIPTION

- 3.1 The site is located on the southeast boundary of an open field used for grazing purposes. There are open fields to the northeast and to the southeast and southwest there is forestry plantation. There is a public road, U1663, to the northwest of the known as the Auchterawe Road. To the northwest of that road there is forestry plantation, which rises to the northwest.
- 3.2 The site is at risk of fluvial flooding based upon the indicative flood risk maps produced by SEPA.
