i. to investigate the possible pedestrianisation of Union Street and Queensgate;ii. to undertake a 'deep clean' of all streets within the curtilage of the City, to plant

trees and shrubs within the City, to make the City a cleaner, greener, fresher place to live, work and visit; and

iii. to ensure that all stakeholders are participants in this Programme.

This Programme of Re-Imagining the City of Inverness will encourage more people into the City, support existing City Centre businesses, and create a café/restaurant culture within the square of Union Street, Queensgate and the Victorian Market.
