Purpose/Executive Summary

Description: Proposed energy storage facility to accommodate up to 50 battery

storage units housed within containers along with ancillary structures

Ward: 12 – Aird and Loch Ness

Recommendation

1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 To inform the Planning Applications Committee of the submission of the attached Proposal of Application Notice (PAN).
- 1.2 The submission of the PAN accords with the provisions of the Planning etc. (Scotland) Act 2006 and was lodged on 7th December 2020. Members are asked to note this may form the basis of a subsequent planning application
- 1.3 The submitted information attached includes:
 - Proposal of Application Notice
 - Location Plan

The applicant had set out that their consultation event would be online via a drop in video consultation on 21st January 2021.

- 1.4 Subsequent to correspondence received from Kilmorack Community Council and a request by the Planning Authority, the applicant has agreed to postpone the community consultation event due to poor broadband connectivity in the area. The applicant is now proposing to:
 - distribute consultation letters to all addresses within 3km of the site which will include details of how to make representations to the developer, and will also include an indicative layout;
 - send further consultation letters to the Community Council, Ward Members, MP and MSP;
 - invite people to arrange to discuss the scheme by phone at a convenient time;
 - provide a more detailed information pack to immediate local residents within circa 1km of the site.

2. DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

- 2.1 Based upon the information provided, the development is likely to comprise of up to 50 battery storage units with an installed capacity of up to 49.9MW. It is envisaged that the battery units would be housed within steel shipping containers. The site would be surrounded by low bunding and landscaping consisting of native trees, along with an inner security fence. Deer fencing would be installed, if necessary, during the establishment of the landscaping.
- 2.2 The applicant has not sought pre-application advice from the Planning Authority via the Pre-Application Advice Service for Major Developments in advance of submission of the PAN.

3. SITE DESCRIPTION

3.1 The site is currently open sloping farmland, lying off the west side of the public road from Kilmorack to Broallan. An 11kv overhead line crosses the site. There is an established woodland on the hillside on the opposite side of the public road. The surrounding area is rural in nature.

Description of Development

The proposed energy storage facility would accommodate up to 50 battery storage units housed within containers along with ancillary structures. It is envisaged that the battery units would be based on steel shipping containers and would have an installed capacity of up to 49.9 Megawatt Hours. The site would be surrounded by low bunding and landscaping consisting of native trees along with an inner security fence, with appropriate deer fencing being installed, if necessary, during the establishment of the landscaping.

The proposed energy storage facility would provide rapid-response electrical back-up to the Electricity Grid and would represent an early deployment within Scotland of a high-tech grid balancing facility, of a type which is already seeing significant deployment in the USA, Australia and other parts of the world. It would also provide employment opportunities through the construction, operation and maintenance of the project.
