Application for the grant of a provisional premises licence under the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005

Dalmore Farm Shop and Restaurant, Dalmore Farm, Alness

Report by the Clerk to the Licensing Board

### Summary

This report relates to an application for the grant of a provisional premises licence in respect of Dalmore Farm Shop and Restaurant, Dalmore Farm, Alness.

# 1.0 Description of premises

1.1 These new premises are located on land at a family farm at Alness. The business will comprise of retail sales including floristry area, food shop, gifts and clothing, and separate restaurant area for 80 people.

# 2.0 Operating hours

2.1 The applicant seeks the following hours:

#### On sales:

Monday to Sunday: 1100 hrs to 2100 hrs

Off sales:

Monday to Sunday: 1000 hrs to 2200 hrs

#### 3.0 Background

- 3.1 On 25 February 2021 the Licensing Board received an application for the provisional grant of a premises licence from Kathryn Christie.
- 3.2 The application was accompanied by the necessary section 50 certification in terms of Planning, together with a Disabled Access Statement.
- 3.3 The application was publicised during the period from 8 to 29 March 2021 and confirmation that the site notice was displayed has been received.

- 3.4 In accordance with standard procedure, Police Scotland, the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service and the Council's Community Services (Environmental Health) and Planning and Building Standards were consulted on the application.
- 3.5 Notification of the application was also sent to NHS Highland and the local Community Council.
- 3.6 Further to this publication and consultation process, no timeous objections or representations have been received.
- 3.7 As a hearing cannot be held in person due to coronavirus, the Licensing Board, before reaching a decision, must give any person who would have been given the opportunity to be heard at the hearing the opportunity to be heard instead by alternative methods. Consequently, the applicant has been invited to submit a written representation to state their case.

# 4.0 Legislation

- 4.1 The Licensing Board must, in considering and determining the application, consider whether any grounds of refusal apply and, if none of them applies, the Board must grant the application.
- 4.2 Relevant grounds of refusal are: -
  - 1. that the premises are excluded premises;
  - 2. that the Board considers, having regard to the licensing objectives, that the applicant is not a fit and proper person to be the holder of a premises licence:
  - 3. that the grant of the application would be inconsistent with one or more of the licensing objectives;
  - 4. that having regard to;
    - (i) the nature of the activities proposed to be carried on in the subject premises,
    - (ii) the location character and condition of the premises, and
    - (iii) the persons likely to frequent the premises,
    - the Board considers the premises are unsuitable for use for the sale of alcohol, or
  - that the Board considers that, if the application were to be granted, there
    would, as a result, be overprovision of licensed premises, or licensed
    premises of the same or similar description as the subject premises, in the
    locality.

- 4.3 For the purposes of the Act, the licensing objectives are-
  - (a) preventing crime and disorder,
  - (b) securing public safety,
  - (c) preventing public nuisance,
  - (d) protecting and improving public health, and
  - (e) protecting children and young persons from harm.
- 4.4 If the Board would refuse the application as made, but a modification is proposed by them and accepted by the applicant, the application can be granted as so modified.

### 5.0 Licensing Standards Officer

- 5.1 The LSO has provided the following comments:
  - a) The Dalmore Farm Shop and Restaurant will be a newly constructed architect designed single storey premises on family farm land adjacent to the A9 Inverness to Thurso trunk road, outside Alness, Easter Ross.
  - b) The premises will operate as a retail, floristry, food and clothing shop along with a restaurant.
  - c) This application for a provisional licence is to allow for the On Sale of alcohol to restaurant customers, there is no bar within the premises and so there will only be table service or self-service from the servery for both the restaurant and outdoor area.
  - d) There will be Off Sales which is primarily to allow for the sale of alcohol from within the food shop area.
  - e) The hours applied for are within the policy of the Highland Licensing Board, and are appropriate for the premises.
  - f) The activities sought would appear to be reasonable and appropriate for the proposed operation of the premises.
  - g) The layout plan submitted complies with the required specifications.
  - h) The Children and Young Persons policy is suitable and considered within the Highland Licensing Board Policy
  - i) There would not appear to be any matter contained within the application that is inconsistent with the licensing objectives.
  - j) During the period of consultation, no timeous objections have been received.
  - k) I have no objection to this application.

# 7.1 Mandatory conditions
