Purpose/Executive Summary

Description: Bettyhill Wind Farm Extension - Erection and operation of a wind farm

for a period of 35 years, comprising 11 wind turbines with a generating capacity of up to 50MW, access track, borrow pits, sub-station, control

building and ancillary infrastructure.

Ward: 01 – North, West and Central Sutherland

1.0 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 This report informs the Planning Applications Committee of the submission of the attached Proposal of Application Notice (PAN).
- 1.2 The submission of the PAN accords with the provisions of the Planning etc. (Scotland) Act 2006 and was made valid on 07 June 2021. The PAN is a statutory requirement for planning applications for major or national developments and must be lodged at least 12 weeks prior to the submission of a planning application. Members are asked to note this may form the basis of a subsequent planning application.
- 1.3 The submitted information attached includes:
 - Proposal of Application Notice (Application Form); and
 - Location Plan
- 1.4 The applicant undertook a public consultation event in Bettyhill Village Hall on 8 July 2021 and then held a virtual event on 15 July 2021 which will allow members of the public to engage in live discussion. The applicant is also going to undertake a second virtual event in September 2021.
- 1.6 The consultation was to be publicised and advertised in accordance with the appropriate statutory requirements with adverts to be placed in the Ross-shire Journal and Press and Journal. The Planning Authority has confirmed that the adverts must be placed in the newspapers at least 7 days before each of the two consultation events. A maildrop will also be undertaken by the applicant to make people aware of the proposed development. The catchment area for this distribution will be within 10km of the site and to include all residents within the Bettyhill, Strathnaver and Altnaharra Community Council and Tongue, Strathy and Melvich Community Council areas.
- 1.7 The forthcoming application will be accompanied by a Pre-Application Consultation (PAC) report explaining the consultation undertaken, feedback received, and any resultant amendments made to the planning application.

2.0 DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

- 2.1 The PAN provides notice of the developer's intention to submit a planning application classified as a Major Development. The proposed development is for the erection and operation of a eleven turbine wind energy development with the capacity to generate up to 50MW. The development will likely comprise wind turbines, access tracks, substation, control building, borrow pits, cabling and associated infrastructure.
- 2.2 The developer has been advised to seek pre-application advice from the Planning Authority through the Council's Pre-Application Advice Service for Major Developments prior to lodging any application.

3.0 SITE DESCRIPTION

- 3.1 The proposed development is located approximately 2km south east of Bettyhill and 10.8km west of Strathy. The development is on an area of open moorland adjacent to the original Bettyhill Wind Farm which comprises of two wind turbines at 110m to blade tip height. Based on knowledge of the area much of the site will likely be covered in peat.
- 3.2 There is an existing access to the site from the A836 which would require to be upgraded to serve the development as it currently is used for estate use and maintenance of the existing wind energy development. The area to the south of the proposed development is sparsely populated but there are a number of small settlements including Crask, Clerkhill, Farr, Swordly and Armadale to the north and north east of the site. There are no core paths located within or adjacent to the site, however the North Coast 500 and National Cycle Network 1 lies to the north of the site boundary.
- 3.3 To the eastern boundary of the site it abuts the Caithness and Sutherland Peatlands Special Protection Area, Ramsar site and Special Area of Conservation, as well as its component Sites of Special Scientific Interest. The area is rich in built and cultural heritage features with a number of these falling within the site boundary.
- 3.4 The site sits across two landscape character types: Rocky Hills and Moorland; and Sweeping Moorland Flows. The Kyle of Tongue National Scenic Area lies to the north west of the site. The Farr Bay, Strathy and Portskerra Special Landscape Area is to the north and north east of the site. Wild Land Area 38 Ben Hope Ben Loyal is located to the west of the site.
- 3.5 When assessing a wind farm proposal, consideration of similar developments in proximity of the proposal for cumulative effects is required. The list below sets out some of the developments in the wider area which will require to be considered by the applicant in their cumulative assessments. However, the final list of developments to be considered by the applicant in their cumulative assessments will be subject to agreement with officers in due course:

- Limekiln Variation 21 Turbines at 149.9m to blade tip height (22.5km east)
