1.1	Applicant: The Mackay Robertson and Fraser Partnership (18/05159/PIP) (NPC/02/20) Location: Lochan Corr, Black Isle Road, Muir of Ord (Ward 8). Nature of Development: Erection of 104 houses. Recommendation: Grant	
	<ul> <li>Agreed: to DEFER the application until such time as the Planning Applications Committees restart or further arrangements are put in place for the following reasons:</li> <li>There has been significant interest in this major scale planning application from the community council and the local community therefore the Chair would like the local members (on NPAC) to be given the opportunity to be involved in the scrutiny and determination of the application.</li> <li>In the interests of transparency, given the Council's interest in the application site.</li> </ul>	Susan Hadfield
1.2	Applicant: Limehillock Quarries Ltd (19/05228/S42) (NPC/03/20) Location: Ledmore Quarry, Elphin, Lairg, Sutherland, IV27 4HJ (Ward 1). Nature of Development: Application for non-compliance with condition 3 (operational timescale) of planning permission 98/00164/FULSU. Recommendation: Grant.	
	The Acting Head of Development Management – Highland summarised the report on handling and shared with the Chair photographs of the application site and photographs showing the relationship of the site with the nearest dwellings. He indicated that there had been issues with surfacing the access to the site where it joins the public road and indicated that this was to be addressed by a condition giving time for implementation that took into account the COVID19 lockdown. He advised that no new issues had been raised following issue of the report on handling.	Claire Farmer
	<b>Points raised:</b> The Chair indicated that there should be careful monitoring of the condition that requires works to the access and that, if required, enforcement action be taken to ensure that the applicant undertook the works required.	

	<b>Agreed:</b> to <b>APPROVE</b> the application for the reasons given in the report of handling and subject to the conditions referred to therein. Compliance with condition 6 to be monitored and, if necessary, enforced.	
1.3	Applicant: Beaufort Wind Limited (19/05504/S42) (NPC/04/20) Location: Novar Wind Farm 1, Novar Estate, Evanton (Ward 6). Nature of Development: Application to vary condition 1 of planning permission RC/1995/421 to extend the operational period of Novar Windfarm from 25 years to 35 years. Recommendation: Grant.	
	The Acting Head of Development Management – Highland summarised the report on handling, explained that the application was because the lifespan of the turbines had exceeded the expectations when the permission was originally granted in 1996 and shared with the Chair photographs of the application site and existing wind farm development. He advised that no new issues had been raised following issue of the report on handling.	Claire Farmer
	<b>Points raised:</b> The Chair sought confirmation that approving the application meant that permission for the existing wind farm would be extended until 2031. The Acting Head of Development Management – Highland confirmed that, if approved, the permission would expire on 27 August 2031.
