The Chair confirmed that the meeting would be webcast and gave a short briefing on the Council's webcasting procedure and protocol.

Business

1. Apologies for absence Leisgeulan

There had been submitted for confirmation as a correct record the minute of meeting of the Committee held on 22 February 2022 which was **APPROVED**.

6.1 Premises – Staff Accommodation, Craiglynne Hotel, Woodlands Terrace, Grantown on Spey

There had been circulated **Report No HLC/019/22** by the Principal Solicitor relating to the grant of a house in multiple occupation licence from Craiglynne Properties Ltd in respect of premises at Craiglynne Hotel, Staff Accommodation Woodlands Terrace, Grantown on Spey (Ward 20 – Badenoch and Strathspey).

The Senior Licensing Officer advised that the Fire Service had visited the premises and had no objection to the application. The necessary building warrant certification had however yet to be received.

The Committee then heard from Mr F Kyriacou, the applicant's representative, who stated that matters had been discussed with the Building Control officers and once the electrical certificates had been received these would be forwarded to Building Control. The staff quarters had been fully renovated and a high standard of accommodation had been achieved.

The delay had been due to burst pipes and delays relating to Covid 19.

The Committee **AGREED** to **GRANT** the licence subject to an additional condition:

7.1 Application for renewal of taxi driver's licence - Norman Reid

There had been circulated **Report No HLC/020/22** by the Principal Solicitor relating to an application which has been received from Norman Reid for the renewal of a taxi driver's licence (Ward 19 – Inverness South).

The applicant was not in attendance. The Senior Licensing Officer advised that confirmation had yet to be received that Mr Reid met the DVLA Group 2 (PSV) standard.

The Committee **AGREED** to **GRANT DELEGATED POWERS** to the Principal Solicitor to refuse the application should the licence holder either (1) fail to produce the required medical information to Alert Health Ltd or (2) Alert Health Ltd confirm that the medical information provided to them does not allow them to state that the licence holder meets the DVLA Group 2 (PSV) medical standard, all by 5 April 2022.
