# 1.0 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 This report informs the Planning Applications Committee of the submission of the attached Proposal of Application Notice (PAN).
- 1.2 The submission of the PAN accords with the provisions of the Planning etc. (Scotland) Act 2006 and was made valid on 19 July 2022. The PAN is a statutory requirement for planning applications for major or national developments and must be lodged at least 12 weeks prior to the submission of a planning application. Members are asked to note this may form the basis of a subsequent planning application.
- 1.3 The submitted information attached includes:
  - Proposal of Application Notice (Application Form)
  - Location Plan
  - Private Cable Route (Sheets 1 to 8)
- 1.4 An in-person consultation event will be held on 23 August 2022 between 1800-2100hrs at Applecross Village Hall, Wester Ross. A virtual consultation event will also be held on 31 August 1800-2100hrs which will be accessible via the project website: <a href="https://www.hydroplan.co.uk/public-consultations">www.hydroplan.co.uk/public-consultations</a> or <a href="https://www.zoom.us.join">www.zoom.us.join</a>, the I.D. being 989 2224 3896. The event will be advertised in the Ross-shire Journal on 12 August 2022.
- 1.5 Details of all notified parties are contained / appended to the PAN form and include Applecross Community Council. Event invitation leaflets are also to be hand delivered to properties within 1km of the proposed cable route on 9 August 2022.
- 1.6 Any forthcoming application will be accompanied by a Pre-Application Consultation (PAC) report explaining the consultation undertaken, feedback received, and any resultant amendments made to the planning application.

#### 2.0 DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

- 2.1 The proposed scheme comprises the installation and operation of approximately 26 kilometres of underground 33kv electricity cable for exporting electricity from Allt Na Moine Hydro Electric Station to Kishorn via the Bealach Na Ba in Wester Ross. Underground electricity cables are regularly installed by a statutory undertaker and therefore usually benefit from having permitted development rights. In this case however, the proposal is for a private electricity cable supply with planning permission therefore being required.
- 2.2 To date, the developer has not sought formal pre-application advice from the Planning Authority through the Pre-Application Advice Service for Major Developments.

## 3.0 SITE DESCRIPTION

3.1 The PAN boundary covers an area measuring 12.8ha, comprising a proposed cable routing which runs from Corrie Mhor Salmon Farm, adjacent to Kishorn Yard in Wester Ross, heading west following the alignment of the public road 'Applecross Pass'

through Applecross, before heading north along the coast terminating at Allt Na Moine powerhouse / switch room which connects with the hydro electric station.

- 3.2 The proposed cable routing intersects a number of designations, environmental constraints and core paths. From Kishorn heading west the initial section of the line falls within the Wester Ross National Scenic Area (NSA), with the route following the southern boundary of the Beinn Bhan Site of Scientific Special Interest (SSSI) and Special Area of Conservation (SAC). The western area of the site also runs close to the coastline which is adjacent to the Inner Hebrides and Minches SAC.
- 3.3 From Kishorn heading west, a section of the route cuts through two areas of woodland which appear on the ancient woodland inventory as long established of plantation origin.
- Public rights of way and core paths are also intersected by the proposed development, notably in proximity of Applecross and to the north west of the settlement.
- 3.5 The proposed routing also crosses areas which are mapped as falling within the 1 in 200 year fluvial flood event; these are most extensive in three sections, at Kishon and in two areas north of Applecross

# 4.2 West Highland and Islands Local Development Plan (2019)

The site is not covered by any specific development allocation or safeguarding notation within the West Highland and Islands Local Development Plan (WHILDP). The proposed routing does however connect to Corrie Mhor Salmon Farm, adjacent to industrial allocation EDA04: Kishorn Yard, Wester Ross. The route also follows the alignment of the 'Applecross Pass' public road which is identified on the WHILDP Vision and Spatial Strategy as forming part of the North Coast 500, with the route

falling within 'Fragile Areas' which require broadband improvements, and Applicross being identified as a 'Potential Community Plan Settlement' with its Placemaking Priorities including:

 'To make the community more energy efficient by introducing measures into existing and new properties; locating new development close to hydro and other energy generation schemes; lobbying for better connections to wider energy networks; and planting more trees to provide a sustainable long term local supply of wood fuel.'
