#### **Purpose/Executive Summary**

- 1.1 The Inverness Common Good Fund Sub-Committee supports the work of the Inverness Common Good Fund. It's remit and delegated powers are set out in Appendix 2. This includes administration of the grant process, decision making on requests for civic hospitality and award of funds for property maintenance, all under £10,000. Any spending decisions above £10,000 are reported to City of Inverness Area Committee (CIAC) for consideration.
- 1.2 This is the annual report that provides a summary of the work of the ICGF Sub-Committee for the financial year 2021/22.

#### 3. Implications

- 3.1 **Resource implications** there are no specific resource implications for this report as it provides a summary of the activity of the ICGF Sub-Committee in the previous financial year. As part of the annual budget, the Sub-Committee continues to operate on the following basis:
  - £75k allocated to applications of £5k and under annually
  - £200k is allocated to applications of over £5k annually

- The general rule is that Applications of more than £5k be considered twice yearly at the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> meetings of the ICGF Sub-Committee during the financial year. £100k will be allocated to each of twice-yearly meetings.
- Applications of more that £10k will still require CIAC approval.

The above has created clarity for applicants and ensures the budget is allocated fairly and efficiently.

#### 4. Background

- 4.1 At the City Committee meeting held on 30<sup>th</sup> November 2017, Members agreed that the Inverness Common Good Fund Sub-Committee shall be required to submit an Annual Report to the City of Inverness Area Committee summarising the work of the Sub-Committee for the immediately preceding Financial Year.
- 4.2 The ICGFSC has representation drawn from Political Groups using the agreed formula. This has produced a Sub-Committee of 11 Members which provides strong and consistent scrutiny. **Appendix 1** details the current membership.
- 4.3 A summary of the powers delegated to the Sub Committee are set out below and **Appendix 2** provides the details of the powers delegated to the Sub Committee.
- 4.3.1 <u>Grants –</u> Delegated Powers to oversee the administration of the grant application process, including the setting if Grant Conditions and reviewing any decision should the circumstances of the application change or the grant remain unclaimed for more than 6 months.
- 4.3.2 <u>Civic Hospitality</u> Delegation to decide on all applications which relate to the provision of support for the Civic Office except Staffing which would remain reserved to the City of Inverness Area Committee. This power would be limited to sums of £10,000 or less
- 4.3.3 <u>City Promotions -</u> Delegated Powers to decide upon allocations to be made from the City Promotions Budget. The Power would be limited to sums of £10,000 or less.
- 4.3.4 <u>City Projects/Property Maintenance</u> Powers to scrutinise and make recommendations to the City of Inverness Area Committee are included which augment the power in respect of Grant Applications in excess of £10,000.

Delegation to Inverness City Area Manager - Power to delegate expenditure on Civic 4.3.5 Hospitality up to a maximum of £300 per event in consultation with the Provost and Sub-Committee Chair.

#### 5. Sub-Group Activity – Grants 2021/22

- 5.1 Appendix 3 summarises budget activity in 2021/22
  - 1. Grants A budget of £275,000 was approved with funds of £275,426 being allocated in the financial year 2021/22. Grants were also awarded from the following budgets, the details of which can be found at 5.2
    - a. Winter Payments Budget £20,000
    - b. City Promotions Budget £23,200
    - c. Other Properties Budget- £39,742
  - 2. Conference Support A budget of £40,000 was approved with funds of £39,175 allocated in the financial year 2021/22.
  - 3. Partnership Working A budget of £151,000 was approved with funds of £127,711 allocated in the financial year 2021/22.
- Appendix 4 summarises the sums allocated for Grants, including Conference Support 5.2 and Partnership Working in 2020/21. The sum of £358K was awarded in grants which includes allocations made from other ICGF budgets.

## Grants

- There were 23 grant awards of under £10k totalling £108,796 awarded to groups • during 2021/22.
- 7 grant awards of over £10k totalling £166,630 were awarded all agreed at CIAC.
- A grant of £20k was awarded from the Winter Payments budget for Blythswood Care: Highland Foodbank - Inverness
- 2 grants of £23,200 were awarded from the City Promotions Budget for the Queen's Green Canopy and Lord Provostship Application
- 3 grants totalling £39,742 were also awarded from the Other Properties Budget • for Apex Scotland: Highland Team Challenge, Inverness Angling Club (IAC): Continuing Management of ICGF Town Fishings and Merkinch LNR: Repair of Boardwalk
- The total amount of grants awarded in 2021/22 across the different ICGF budgets was £358,368

#### **Conference Support**

Conference support of £39,175 was provided to Monsterfest Rocks Limited, Change Your World Events Ltd, Visit Inverness Loch Ness and LCC Live Events Services Ltd.

#### Partnership Working

Grants totalling £127,711 were awarded to Inverness Business Improvement District and Visit Inverness Loch Ness for Partnership Working.

#### 5.3 **City Centre Recovery Fund**

The Council had the opportunity to apply to the City Centre Recovery Fund in March 2022. The Fund was provided by the Scottish Government in support of City Centre activity which encouraged people back in to use the services provided within City Centres. Inverness was allocated £360,000 and the following projects, supported by the ICGF, were successful in applying.

- Floral Displays 2021 £61,000
- City Winter Events Programme 2021 £137,000

This will be shown as income to the ICGF when the final accounts for 2021/22 are presented to Committee later in the year.

#### 6. Sub-group Activity Civic Hospitality 2021/22

- 6.1 The Covid 19 pandemic resulted in no allocations being made from the £125,000 budget during 2021/22. In line with Scottish Government guidance, the Town House is now able to be used for civic hospitality once again. The Common Good Fund sub-committee are scrutinising the operation of the civic hospitality budget for the current financial year very closely, noting the increased pressure on costs and the number of events being applied for, this has included a review of the recurring events list. Any events that have been removed from the list will still be able to apply for funding in the usual way.
- 6.2 **In respect of 20222/23, 21/22** A number of recurring events are supported from the Civic Hospitality budget,. Prior to an event being included in this category careful consideration is given to the events status, with only those of significance to the City being included. Those that go forward to application stage, will only be approved under delegated powers by the sub-committee should the event remain within expected budget. This includes events such as the Kirking of the Council and Remembrance Sunday.

#### 7. Conclusion

- 7.1 The operational powers delegated to the Inverness Common Good Fund Sub-Committee continue to enhance the effective management of the Common Good Fund. The Sub Committee has scrutinised project funding with a focus on ensuring that projects bring principal benefit to residents of the Burgh.
- 7.2 The communications plan will ensure that supported events and projects receive as high a profile as practicable. Supported projects are required to publicise that they have received support from the ICGF within all appropriate publicity.

# Powers Delegated in Full by the City of Inverness Area Committee to the Inverness Common Good Fund Sub Committee

- 1. To carry out any duties delegated from the City of Inverness Area Committee in relation to the administration of the Inverness Common Good Fund.
- 2. All powers delegated shall be exercised as fully delegated powers and be applicable to the operation of the Inverness Common Good Fund.
- 3. Notwithstanding the above powers specifically delegated are;
  - a. To decide on all administrative matters relating to the operation of the Inverness Common Good Fund excepting decisions affecting Cash or Equity Investments.
  - b. Grants to decide on all applications for financial assistance where the sum applied for is £10,000 or less. In respect of applications in excess of £10,000, to make recommendations to the City of Inverness Area Committee.
  - c. Other applications for funding to decide upon all other applications for financial assistance where the sum applied for is £10,000 or less or where the sum requested relates to the provision of Staff
  - d. Project Monitoring to consider reports from officers on the progress of projects approved by the City of Inverness Area Committee and to make recommendations to the City of Inverness Area Committee as appropriate
  - e. Civic Hospitality to decide upon all applications for Civic Hospitality where the total cost of the event does not exceed £10,000, including the power to delegate approval of events to the Inverness City Area Manager in consultation with the Chair and the Provost where the cost of the event does not exceed £300.
  - f. Property Maintenance Power to scrutinise all expenditure from property maintenance budgets where the sum expended exceeds £10,000 on any one project.
  - g. City Promotions to decide upon allocations to be made from the City Promotions Budget where the sum does not exceed £10,000
  - h. Tenancy Management to decide upon all applications for lease, Assignation of Lease, Rent Review or any other Tenancy related matter where the Director of Development and Infrastructure has seen fit not exercise Delegated Powers
