Purpose/Executive Summary

Description: Construction of alternative access for Strathy South Wind Farm

Ward: 01-North, West and Central Sutherland

Recommendation

1.0 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 This report informs the Planning Applications Committee of the submission of the attached Proposal of Application Notice (PAN).
- 1.2 The submission of the PAN accords with the provisions of the Planning etc. (Scotland) Act 2006 and was made valid on 14 September 2022. The PAN is a statutory requirement for planning applications for major or national developments and must be lodged at least 12 weeks prior to the submission of a planning application. Members are asked to note this may form the basis of a subsequent planning application.
- 1.3 The submitted information attached includes:
 - Proposal of Application Notice (Application Form)
 - Location Plan
 - Site Layout Plan
- 1.4 An in-person consultation event will be held on week commencing 24 October 2022 date and time to be confirmed at Strathy Village Hall, Strathy. A virtual consultation event will also be held via the project website: https://www.sserenewables.com/onshore-wind/in-development/strathy-south/ time and date also to be confirmed. The event will be advertised in the Northern Times at least two weeks ahead of the events, which exceeds the statutory minimum of seven days.
- 1.5 Details of all notified parties are contained / appended to the PAN form and include Strathy & Armadale, Melvich, and, Bettyhill, Strathnaver and Altnaharra Community Councils, and local Members. Event invitation leaflets are also to be hand delivered to properties within these Community Council Areas.
- 1.6 Any forthcoming application will be accompanied by a Pre-Application Consultation (PAC) report explaining the consultation undertaken, feedback received, and any resultant amendments made to the planning application.

2.0 DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

2.1 The proposal is for an alternative access for Strathy South Wind Farm than that approved by Scottish Ministers. The applicant has highlighted that it would retain use of the consented track until a short distance south of the crossing of the Uidh nan Con Luatha watercourse. From there It is proposed that the existing track to serve the consented but not yet built Strathy Wood Wind Farm would be upgraded and form the remainder of the access to the Strathy South Wind Farm. The track section is a little over 6km in length, runs alongside the River Strathy and bypasses a section of forestry track through Strathy Forest used by the Strathy North Wind Farm. The stated purpose of using this track is to avoid the construction of additional track in sensitive areas, which would require the installation of significant water crossing of the River Strathy.

2.2 The developer sought formal pre-application advice from the Planning Authority through the Pre-Application Advice Service for Major Developments in 2019 for the larger wind farm proposal (HC ref. 19/02072/PREMAJ).

3.0 SITE DESCRIPTION

- 3.1 The PAN boundary covers the section of access track that the application will relate to, which begins just south of Bowside Lodge and east of Dallangwell and runs southwards loosely following the course of the River Strathy before cutting through the south of Strathy Forest and rejoining the access track to Strathy South Wind Farm as originally approved. The track section connects with the main access route from the A836 to the north, used by all of the wind farm developments at Strathy; namely, Strathy North, Strathy Wood, and Strathy South.
- 3.2 The track section would be constructed over peat and areas of blanket bog, and runs through several natural heritage designations including the Caithness and Sutherland Special Protection Area (SPA), Special Area of Conservations (SAC), and Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI). The track cuts through the Strathy Forest commercial conifer plantation, however there are no other natural heritage or landscape designations within the site boundary. There are no Core Paths however the track and wider area is subject to the Land Reform (Scotland) Act 2003 where members of the public may reasonably exercise their rights to public access. There are no Listed Buildings or Scheduled Monuments in the vicinity of the site.
- 3.5 The proximity of the site to the River Strathy means some parts of the proposed site are at risk of flooding in a 1:200 year plus climate change fluvial flood event. However, only small sections of the track that relate to this proposal are at risk according to the indicative SEPA Flood Risk Mapping.

Upgrade of existing forestry specification track to a wind farm specification track of six metres running width plus additions drainage and ancillary development including the installation of passing places and upgrading and replacement of watercourse crossings.

(Note: Consent is sought to amend the access arrangements to Strathy South Wind Farm. The proposal is to utilise the access track consented for use for the neighbouring Strathy Wood Wind Farm. This is shown in the drawing attached to this notice.

This avoids the construction of track serving only Strathy South Wind Farm and negates the need for a significant water crossing to be constructed over the River Strathy).
