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Purpose/Executive Summary

1.1 Members must be informed when an amendment of any Traffic Regulation Order is proposed that allows the enforcement of mandatory parking charges at Council off-street car parks.

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Recommendations

2.1 Members are asked to **Agree** the proposal to advertise the necessary amendment of the 2016 off-street Traffic Regulation Order which will prescribe enforcement of mandatory parking charges at the Achmelvich Beach Car Park in Sutherland.

3 Implications

- 3.1 **Resource** Without the securing of income from the site the Council will be unable to match fund grant funding from the Rural Tourism Infrastructure Fund.
- 3.2 **Legal** To allow the enforcement of parking charges an amendment to the Off-street Traffic Regulation is required to be made through Statutory Consultation.
- 3.3 **Community (Equality, Poverty, Rural and Island)** 50% of any surplus income will be available to the Committee to re-invest in local infrastructure/community projects.
- 3.4 **Climate Change / Carbon Clever –** The site will provide additional facilities for cycle storage.

- 3.5 **Risk** The joint funded project to create a fit for purpose destination facility at Achmelvich will not proceed without the capital borrowing required from the Highland Council.
- 3.6 **Gaelic** No implications.

4 Achmelvich Beach Car Park

4.1 Members will be aware of a project to redevelop the Achmelvich Beach car park site to provide a fit for purpose destination site with adequate toilet facilities for visitors to this popular destination.

A recent successful application for external match funding requires capital borrowing that must be secured by repayment from revenue generation at this site.

- 4.2 Income raised from compulsory charging will cover loan charges and running costs, and in the longer term deliver additional income to the Committee. Council policy ensures that 50% of all surplus income will be allocated to the Sutherland County Committee to invest as they see fit.
- 4.3 A detailed paper on the business case for this project will be submitted to Economy and Infrastructure Committee on 22 November 2022.

5 Traffic Regulation Order

- 5.1 Local Committees must be informed of any proposal to advertise a traffic regulation order as per current council policy. The proposed order amendment will allow the enforcement of mandatory parking charges at Achmelvich Beach car Park. A statutory public consultation will be undertaken. If any objections are received that cannot be resolved by officers, the matter will be taken back to a future committee for a Members' decision.
- 5.2 The proposed amendment will introduce an enforceable tariff in addition to the existing control of use order that applies to this car park. Charges will apply from 9am to 5pm 7 days per week an are up to 4 hrs £3; up to 6 hrs £4; up to 8 hrs £5; and NO vehicles manufactured or adapted for the purpose of sleeping between 10pm and 8am
