Application for a major variation of premises licence under the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005

The Fishertown Inn, Church Street, Cromarty

Report by the Clerk to the Licensing Board

Summary

This report relates to an application for a major variation of premises licence by Thomas Brodie in respect of The Fishertown Inn, Church Street, Cromarty.

1.0 Description of premises

1.1 The premises are on the ground floor of a two storey semi-detached building comprising large bistro bar with tables, bar and kitchen in the town of Cromarty. There is an outside drinking area and eating area to the front of the premises and beer garden to the rear of the premises. The premises licence was granted on conversion on 1 September 2009.

2.0 Current operating hours

2.1 The premises currently has the following operating hours:

On sales:

Monday to Saturday: 1100 hrs to 0100 hrs Sunday: 1200 hrs to 2330 hrs

Off sales:

Monday to Saturday: 1100 hrs to 2200 hrs Sunday: 1200 hrs to 2200 hrs

3.0 Summary of variation application

3.1 Variation sought

The applicant seeks to vary the premises licence as follows:-

- 1) amend the opening hours on Sunday to commence at 1100 hrs for on and off sales and terminate at 0100 hrs for on sales;
- 2) amend the layout plan to update the outdoor drinking area;
- 3) remove the provision of accommodation;

- 4) update the description on the premises licence;
- 5) add club meetings and films to activities provided during core hours;
- 6) add music and outdoor drinking to activities provide outwith core hours;
- 7) add takeaway meals to other services provided;
- 8) update the children and young persons policy;
- 9) add seasonal variation;
- 10) add outdoor on sales capacity;
- 11) remove off sales capacity off sales to be taken from stock.

4.0 Background

- 4.1 On 1 February 2023 the Licensing Board received an application for a major variation of a premises licence from Ingrid and Peter Rochford, Rochford and Gunn.
- 4.2 The application was publicised during the period 10 February to 3 March 2023 and confirmation that the site notice was displayed has been received.
- 4.3 In accordance with standard procedure, Police Scotland, the Scottish Fire & Rescue Service and the Council's Community Services (Environmental Health) and Planning and Building Standards were consulted on the application.
- 4.4 Notification of the application was also sent to NHS Highland and the local Community Council.
- 4.5 Further to this publication and consultation process, no timeous objections or representations have been received.
- 4.6 The applicant must nevertheless be given the opportunity to be heard before the Board determines the application and has accordingly been invited to the meeting. The applicant has been advised of the hearings procedure which may also be viewed via the following link:

5.0 Legislation

- 5.1 The Licensing Board must in considering and determining the application, consider whether any grounds of refusal apply and if none of them applies, the Board must grant the application.
- 5.2 Relevant grounds of refusal may be: -
 - 1. the grant of the application will be inconsistent with one or more of the licensing objectives;
 - 2. having regard to (i) the nature of the activities carried on or proposed to be carried on in the subject premises, (ii) the location, character and condition of the premises, and (iii) the persons likely to frequent the premises, the

Board considers the premises are unsuitable for use for the sale of alcohol in accordance with the proposed variation;

- 3. that the Board considers that, if the application were to be granted, there would, as a result, be overprovision of licensed premises, or licensed premises of the same or similar description as the subject premises, in the locality.
- 5.3 For the purposes of the Act, the licensing objectives are-
 - (a) preventing crime and disorder,
 - (b) securing public safety,
 - (c) preventing public nuisance,
 - (d) protecting and improving public health, and
 - (e) protecting children and young persons from harm.
- 5.4 The Board only has power either to grant the application and make a variation of the conditions to which the licence is subject or to refuse the application.
- 5.5 If the Board refuses the application, the Board must specify the ground for refusal and if the ground for refusal relates to a licensing objective, the Board must specify the objective in question.

6.0 Licensing Standards Officer

- 6.1 The LSO has provided the following comments:-
 - 1) The property known as The Fishertown Inn is a long established licensed premises previously known as the Cromarty Arms.
 - 2) The premises offers on sales and off sales, but primarily is a restaurant/bistro type property. The variation application seeks to extend activities on the premises and change the description of the premises to reflect the change to alcohol offering to be mainly but not solely as ancillary to food. There is also a change to the Children and Young Persons policy.
 - 3) The premises have operated for many years without adverse comment.
 - 4) The activities sought would appear to be reasonable and appropriate for the proposed operation of the premises.
 - 5) The Children's and Young Persons policy is appropriate.
 - 6) The layout plan submitted complies with the required specifications.
 - 7) There would not appear to be any matter contained within the application that is inconsistent with the licensing objectives.
 - 8) During the period of public consultation, no objections were received.

9) I have no objection to this application.

7.0 HLB local policies

- 7.1 The following policies are relevant to the application:-
 - (1) Highland Licensing Board Policy Statement 2018-23
 - (2) Highland Licensing Board Equality Strategy

8.0 Conditions

8.1 **Mandatory conditions**

If the application is approved the mandatory conditions set out in Schedule 3 of the Act will apply.

8.2 Local conditions

Existing local conditions will continue to apply and it is recommended that the following additional local conditions be attached:

- I. The boundaries of any outside area will be effectively demarcated to the satisfaction of the Licensing Standards Officer.
- m. After 2200 hrs, alcoholic or non-alcoholic drinks shall not be consumed in any outdoor drinking area
- o. The licence holder shall ensure that consumption of drinks (alcoholic or non-alcoholic) in any outside drinking area is permitted only by customers seated at the tables and chairs provided in the outside drinking area and not by customers standing in that area.

Recommendation

The Board is invited to determine the above application and if minded to grant the application, to agree the proposed additional local conditions detailed at para 8.2 above.

If the Board is minded to refuse the application, the Board must specify the ground for refusal and if the ground for refusal is in relation to a licensing objective, the Board must specify the objective in question.
