Premises licence review hearing Review application under section 36(1) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005

Uncle Bob's Bar, 1 High Street, Nairn, IV12 4AG

Report by the Clerk to the Licensing Board

Summary

This report relates to a premises licence review hearing under section 38 of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 following submission to the Board of a premises licence review application under section 36(1) of the Act.

1. Background

- 1.1 An application has been received under section 36 of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 from the Council's Environmental Health Service for a review of the existing premises licence for the premises known as Uncle Bob's Bar, 1 High Street, Nairn, IV12 4AG. The premises licence (Ref. HC/INBS/42) is held by Alhama UBB Ltd, 79 High Street, Nairn, IV12 4BW.
- 1.2 The review application, dated 19 January 2023, is appended to this report (Appendix 1). The alleged grounds for review and the information considered by the review applicant to support these grounds are as set out in the review application. In terms of section 36(6) of the Act, the Clerk to the Board is satisfied that the review application is neither frivolous nor vexatious and that it discloses matters relevant to one or more of the alleged grounds for review, which is one of the statutory grounds for review. A premises licence review hearing is accordingly necessary.
- 1.3 The Licensing Standards Officer for the area in which the premises are situated has been sent a copy of the review application in accordance with section 38(3) of the Act and has submitted a report on it which is also appended (Appendix 2). The Board must take this report into account at the hearing.
- 1.4 The premises licence holder has also been sent a copy of the review application. The premises licence holder, a representative from the Council's Environmental Health Service and the Licensing Standards Officer have been invited to attend the hearing. They have been advised of the hearing procedure which will be followed at the meeting and which may also be viewed via the following link:

2. Legal position

2.1 Grounds for review

- 2.1.1 The statutory grounds for review of a premises licence are set out in subsections 36(3)(za) to (b) of the Act. They are-
 - 36(3)(za) that, having regard to the licensing objectives, the licence holder is not a fit and proper person to be the holder of a premises licence,
 - 36(3)(a) that one or more of the conditions to which the premises licence is subject has been breached, or
 - 36(3)(b) any other ground relevant to one or more of the licensing objectives.
- 2.1.2 For the purposes of the Act, the licensing objectives are-
 - (a) preventing crime and disorder,
 - (b) securing public safety,
 - (c) preventing public nuisance,
 - (d) protecting and improving public health, and
 - (e) protecting children and young persons from harm.
- 2.1.3 Where the ground alleged in the review application is that specified in subsection 36(3)(za), the application must include a summary of the information on which the applicant's view that the alleged ground applies is based.

Where the ground alleged is that specified in subsection 36(3)(a), the application must include notice of the condition or conditions alleged to have been breached.

Where the ground alleged is that specified in subsection 36(3)(b), the application must include notice of the licensing objective or objectives to which the alleged ground of review relates.

These requirements have been met in the review application.

2.2 The Board's powers in respect of the premises licence

- 2.2.1 In terms of section 39(1) of the Act, at a premises licence review hearing the Board may, if satisfied that a ground for review is established (whether or not on the basis of any circumstances alleged in the premises licence review application considered at the hearing), decide
 - to take no action, or
 - to take such of the steps mentioned in section 39(2) of the Act as the Board consider necessary or appropriate for the purposes of any of the licensing objectives.

2.2.2 Those steps are-

- (a) to issue a written warning to the licence holder
- (b) to make a variation of the licence for such period as the Board may determine,
- (c) to suspend the licence for such period as the Board may determine,
- (d) to revoke the licence
- 2.2.3 However, this is subject to the requirement in section 39(2A) that where the Board are satisfied that the ground for review specified in subsection 36(3)(za) is established (i.e. the ground that the licence holder is not a fit and proper person to hold the licence), the Board must revoke the licence.
- 2.2.4 A revocation under section 39(2A) takes effect at the end of the period of 28 days beginning with the day on which the Board makes the decision, unless the revocation is recalled by the Board. It must be recalled if the Board either grants an application under s33 for the transfer of the premises licence, or grants a premises licence variation application seeking a variation which the Board considers would remove the ground on which the licence was revoked under section 39(2A). The transfer or variation application must be received within the 28-day period, but the Board may then extend the 28-day period pending determination of the application.
- 2.2.5 Should the Board make a variation under section 39(2)(b) or suspend the licence under section 39(2)(c), the Board may subsequently revoke the variation or suspension, on the application of the licence holder, if satisfied that, by reason of a change of circumstances, the variation or suspension is no longer necessary.

2.3 Additional action in relation to personal licence holder working in the premises

- 2.3.1 In the course of a premises licence review hearing the Board may also make a finding in respect of any personal licence holder who is or was working in the premises that the personal licence holder concerned, while working in the premises, acted in a manner which was inconsistent with any of the licensing objectives.
- 2.3.2 Should the Board make such a finding, this will trigger a separate and subsequent hearing under section 84 of the Act in respect of the personal licence holder.

Recommendation

The Board is invited to hear from the Environmental Health Service, the Licensing Standards Officer and the premises licence holder and then-

- (a) to decide whether they are satisfied that any of the grounds for review set out in section 36(3) of the Act, and listed at **paragraph 2.1.1** above, are established and, if so
- (b) to decide whether they consider it necessary or appropriate for the purposes of any of the licensing objectives to take any of the steps set out in section 39(2) of the Act and listed at **paragraph 2.2.2** above. In this regard, the Board must specify the licensing objective(s) in question.

If the Board is satisfied that the ground for review specified in section 36(3)(za) is established, the Board must revoke the premises licence, as explained at **paragraph 2.2.3 above**.

The Board is also invited to decide, as explained at **paragraph 2.3.1** above, whether to make a finding in respect of any personal licence holder who is or was working on the premises that the personal licence holder, while working in the premises, acted in a manner which was inconsistent with any of the licensing objectives and, if so, to fix a further hearing under section 84 of the Act in respect of that personal licence holder.

HOW TO MAKE A REVIEW APPLICATION IN RELATION TO A PREMISES LICENCE UNDER THE LICENSING (SCOTLAND) ACT 2005

Background

These guidance notes contain information for individuals who wish to apply to the Highland Licensing Board for a review of a premises licence under the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005. They give general guidance only and all persons seeking to make a review application are advised to seek legal advice.

Any person may apply to the Licensing Board for a review of a premises licence issued by that Board. All review applications will be considered by the Board unless the Licensing Board has rejected the application on the grounds that it is considered to be frivolous or vexatious or does not disclose any matter relevant to any ground for review. If an application has been rejected by the Board as frivolous or vexatious, the Board may seek to recover expenses from the person making the review application.

Before making a formal premises licence review application, any person may ask for advice and guidance from the Licensing Standards Officer within whose area of responsibility the subject premises are situated. Licensing Standards Officers have a specific remit to provide mediation services for the purpose of avoiding or resolving disputes or disagreements between the holders of premises licences and any other persons.

☐ Grounds for Review

Applications for review of a premises licence must be lodged in writing addressed to the Clerk to the Licensing Board (either by email sent to licensing@highland.gov.uk or by post or hand delivery) to the nearest office (listed overleaf) for the area in which the premises concerned are situated. There is no format for the application to review but it is suggested that the attached form is used.

The grounds for review are as follows:-

1. That, having regard to the licensing objectives, the licence holder is not a fit and proper person to be the holder of a premises licence

preventing crime and disorder securing public safety preventing public nuisance protecting and improving public health protecting children and young persons from harm

- 2. one or more of the conditions to which the premises licence is subject has been breached;
- 3. Any other ground relevant to one or more of the licensing objectives:

preventing crime and disorder securing public safety preventing public nuisance protecting and improving public health protecting children and young persons from harm

General

The Clerk's Office will send a copy of all review applications received to the licence holder and the Licensing Standards Officer for the area in which the premises concerned are situated. If the Board receives a review application which is not considered frivolous or vexatious then a hearing before the Licensing Board will be held at which both the person who has applied for the review and the premises licence holder will be given an opportunity to be heard. The Board will expect any application to be evidence based.

Please note that with the exception of review applications which the Board considers to be frivolous or vexatious, or which fail to disclose any matter relevant to any ground for review, the Board is obliged to consider all applications received.

1.	Preventing crime and disorder

Securing public safety		Since July 2022, our Service has received complaints from three local residents regarding patrons congregating on the rear fire escape as a smoking area resulting in disturbance and anti-social behaviour. The fire escape is a metal stairway located at first floor level at the rear of the premises. It has designed as an emergency exits route only. As the premises allows patrons to congregate on the fire escape, particularly when under the influence of alcohol, it introduces a foreseeable risk of them falling/slipping down the stairs which could result in serious injury.		

3. Preventing public nuisance

Since July 2022, our Service has received complaints for three local residents regarding Uncle Bob's Bar using the rear fire escape as smoking area. а complainants advise that patrons of the bar are regularly congregating in the rear fire escape stairway which results in disturbance from loud voices, anti-social behaviour and break-out music noise.

The rear fire escape is located at first floor level, only approximately 15mtetres away from residential properties

The residents have used the Noise App¹ to provide sound recordings of the disturbance. The recordings submitted provide evidence that noise from patrons' voices and amplified music is clearly audible within the complainants' properties. The disturbance occurs on a regular basis and can occur as late as 01:00am.

Given the evidence on the sound recordings, our Service is of the opinion the use of the rear fire escape as a smoking area is causing significant disturbance to local residents, would interrupt their sleep and interfere with the use and enjoyment of their property.

Our Service wrote to the licensee of the premises on 09/11/2022 to inform him of the continuing complaints and to advise that procedures are put in place to prevent patrons using the fire escape as a smoking area. Officers also met with the Manageress of the premises 21/11/2022 to discuss the issue further and try to resolve the matter informally.

However, our Service has received continuing complaints regarding noise from patrons congregating on the fire escape. The most recent recordings were submitted between 21st December 2022 - 14th January 2023 and indicate that patrons' voices and amplified music are still clearly audible within

		the complainant's property. Based on the evidence obtained, our Service of the opinion that the continued use of the fire escape as a smoking area wou constitute a public nuisance. Therefore, our Service would ask the Boar to review the licence with a view of including a condition which restricts the use of the refire escape as a smoking area, requires the fire door to be kept closed and only used the event of an emergency.





SUBJECT: COMPLAINT REGARDING DISTURBANCE CAUSED BY PATRONS

SMOKING ON FIRE ESCAPE

PREMISES: "UNCLE BOB'S BAR" 1 HIGH STREET, NAIRN

I am writing to inform you that our Service has received continuing complaints in respect of disturbance caused by patrons using the fire escape as a smoking area.

Several residents have advised that patrons regularly congregate in the rear fire escape stairway which results in disturbance from loud voices, anti-social behaviour and break-out music noise. Evidence provided indicates that the fire escape is still used as a smoking area after 22:00hours and noise from the patrons and music is clearly audible within the complainants' properties such that it would cause disturbance and interrupt sleep.

The Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 requires premises to be run in line with 5 Licensing Objectives. The Third Objective is in relation to the Prevention of Public Nuisance, this covers noise and other matters.

It is the responsibility of the management to ensure behaviour of noisy patrons' does not cause a noise nuisance. It is expected that the management must take all reasonable steps to reduce the noise from patrons, including whilst they are using any external areas.

If further evidence in respect of noise nuisance is received, the matter can be referred to the Licensing Board for a Premises Licence Review. The Licensing Board have a variety of options available on Review which can include varying the Licence to restrict operations.

Furthermore, if the noise amounted a statutory noise nuisance in terms of the Environmental Protection Act 1990, then our Service would also have duty to serve an Abatement Notice on the person responsible requiring them to abate the nuisance. Failure to comply with an Abatement Notice would be an offence.

In addition to the above there are health and safety concerns in patron congregating on the fire escape. The Health and Safety at Work etc Act 1974 requires employers to protect the health, safety and welfare at work of all their employees, as well as others on their premises, including customers. Allowing patrons to congregate on the fire escape, particularly when under the influence of alcohol, introduces a

foreseeable risk of them falling/slipping down the stairs which could result in serious injury.

In view of the above, I would advise that you put procedures in place to prevent patrons using the fire escape as a smoking area. The fire escape should only be used for the purposes intended in event of an emergency. Patrons who wish to smoke should be directed to leave the premises by the main exit/entrance and smoke outside at the front of the premises. Patrons should not be permitted to congregate and smoke in the fire escape and the fire door should be kept closed.

If our Service receives further evidence that the patrons are congregating on the fire escape causing disturbance to residents, we will have no option but to proceed with a view of taking formal action as detailed above.

I trust that this clarifies the position which respect this complaint and would appreciate your cooperation in resolving this matter. However, should you wish to discuss any aspect of this complaint any further, then please do not hesitate to contact me on the number above.



Report by Licensing Standards Officer

Summary: Licensing Standards Officer's report in terms of section 38(4) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 in response to an application for a premises licence review submitted by Environmental Health Officer, Zoe Skinner in respect of Alhama UBB Ltd HC/INBS/42 for Uncle Bob's Bar, 1 High Street, Nairn, IV12 4AG.

1. Licensing History

- 1.1 Premises licence HC/INBS/42 for the premises of Uncle Bob's Bar, 1 High Street, Nairn was transferred to Alhama UBB Ltd with effect from 13 August 2019 by the Highland Licensing Board in accordance with the licensed hours and other policies of the Board at that time. The premises prior to this had held an alcohol premises licence since 1 September 2009 under different ownership.
- 1.2 The connected person for the company holding the premises licence is Alan Milton. In the past Mr Milton has acted as the premises manager on occasion.
- 1.3 The premises operate principally as a public bar. The premises are on the first floor of a terraced building and are accessed from street level by a stairway. The bar itself is constructed of a single room with the bar counter at one end and a fire escape door at the other end which leads to a metal fire escape which has a stairway leading to ground level at the rear of the premises.
- 1.4 The fire escape door cannot be properly supervised by bar staff working behind the bar as there is restricted line of sight. The premises on their operating plan have no approved outside drinking area with the licensing footprint comprising solely of the bar area.
- 1.5 The premises are a busy and popular local venue, particularly at the weekends. The customer base are mainly young people in the 20-30 year age range. The operating history of the premises has been satisfactory.
- **1.6** The premises are subject to mandatory and local licensing conditions concerning the presence of children and positioning of dartboards and pool table.
- 1.7 Since July 2022, I have been made aware by Zoe Skinner, Environmental Health Officer, Inverness, that their Service has been dealing with noise complaints from local residents disturbed by noise coming from patrons of the bar who are using the top landing of the fire escape as an external smoking area. I am aware that these matters have been raised with the

owner of the Bar, Mr Milton, with better supervision of the fire escape by duty staff as the suggested resolution.

1.8 Despite these requests the noise issues have persisted. Zoe Skinner contacted me in September 2022 to update me that further complaints from the existing complainer had been received. Accordingly, during a routine compliance check of the premises on 30 September 2022, I raised the matter with the owner Mr Milton and suggested that patrons requiring to smoke should be directed to the front of the premises on the High Street. Signage should also be posted on the fire escape door enforcing this direction.

2. Process

- 2.1 On 19 January 2023, in terms of section 38(3) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005, I received notice of a premises licence review application submitted by Zoe Skinner EH Officer, Highland Council in respect of Uncle Bob's Bar, 1 High Street, Nairn.
- 2.2 This report is submitted in in accordance with the terms of section 38(4)(a) of the 2005 Act.

3. Circumstances

- 3.1 Between 21 December 2022 and 14 January 2023, sound recordings had been obtained from within complainant's properties of audible customer noise from the patrons of the bar still using the fire escape as a smoking terrace. Pictorial evidence had also been secured.
- 3.2 I understand the review application relates to the failure of the licence holder to engage, positively, with the licensing objectives specifically those of the prevention of public nuisance and securing public safety arising from the inability of the licence holder to properly supervise and manage patrons as previously discussed and agreed with him.

3.3 Legislation and interpretation

The Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 is underpinned by the 5 licensing objectives.

- (a) Preventing crime and disorder
- (b) securing public safety
- (c) preventing public nuisance
- (d) Protecting and improving public health, and
- (e) protecting children and young persons from harm.

- 4 Licensing Standards Officer's comments.
- **4.1** It is the view of the Licensing Standards Officer that a potential route to resolution would be the imposition of a specific licensing condition on the premises licence:

At all times duty staff shall ensure that customers do not use the rear fire escape as a smoking and/or drinking area.

This condition supports the licensing objectives of preventing public nuisance and securing public safety.
