The Committee:

- i. **NOTED** all applications presented for funding and that approval of funding should detail the amount approved, and outline any conditions of funding that Members wished to attach to the approval over and above the required technical conditions. A deferral would allow an applicant to resubmit the current application at a future date with updated information or for the project to be approved subject to further funding becoming available. A rejection would mean that the application will not proceed and any future application to the fund should be brought forward initially as a new expression of interest; and
- ii. **AGREED,** as detailed above, which applications should receive a funding award from CRF up to the value of the available area allocation.
