3. **Matters Arising**

Items in minutes of 7th March 2022 but not on agenda or Table of Caithness Access Issues and Initiatives

<u>Thurso High School</u> – since the last meeting signs have been installed at the school grounds to restrict public access to playing fields during school day and not permit dogs at any time. The public right of way from Ormlie Road to Juniper Bank through the schools car park is unaffected. Other plans to secure the school grounds (it is currently predominately unfenced) have probably take a back seat as there has been building structure matters at the school.

<u>Camster Windfarm</u> – no progress on side gate instal to the side of the locked field gates. WB suggested MD had tried to resolve this matter so too long and should take further, BMG agreed. **Action - MD to take further.**

This led to general discussion on unauthorised vehicle access. DM said there was still motorbike activity from the Blingery access. KR raised activity at Ormlie Moor which was a long standing occurrence, MD mentioned Pentland Housing had previously ignored any request to manage. Cairn now manage the land, Action – MD to contact Cairn to ask managing access from their land

<u>Access Rangers</u> – MD stated that the Winter staff were starting their patrols for the start of this season over the Easter weekends. Access Rangers visit many car parks and discussion on payment for parking came up.

AJ said he thought invitation to pay had been successful. WB stated many visitors were more than keen, and if fact expected to pay, WB also suggested that any move to compulsory charging would only be supported if local residents did not have to pay.

Halkirk to Sibster Link

MD stated that Gillian Coghill has worked to identify landowners and arranged a visit with MD. Both landowners in general agreement that a path may be built if done under lease/agreement with the Halkirk Village Council.

There is a strip of ground just outside the Forest and Land Scotland holding which is of unknown ownership, as this would be the location of one abutment of the bridge required it is important to identify the owners. 100k verbally agreed from Halirk District Commuity Benefit Fund.

Next step is planning application and progressing agreements

Altnabreac Railway Crossing

No change – still awaiting Minister decision on Core Path plan review proposals.

Dalwhinnie Crossing closure has raised profile and this matter is being resolved first but should then lead to timely answer to Altnabreac.

Yarrows Heritage Trail

No progress on signs and new gates. Try again with contractor, if not look elsewhere. Ground still poached. MD thinks visitor numbers are low. WB said he still sees visitors coming to find the trail.

Whaligoe

JW agreed the barbed/spiked fence is no longer an issue – close case. The path around the croft though still needs improvements (bridges). MD pointed out the car park also is not suitable for the level of use it gets.

Keiss Shore Sign

Sign long since removed, new signs to JOBT on gates etc. Field gate, installed as part of pod development, spring bolt to be improved. **ACTION -MD to follow up with developer**.

Mireland Access Gates

Follow up new access tracks to south and how this may link up with the bridge which is on poor condition but now with side pedestrian only gate

Sandside Cliff Top Locked Gate

PC reported contact made with owners and MD has passed details of improvements required. PC to follow up as reasonable.

Considerations for Core Path Plan Changes

JW asked that John O'Groats Trail is considered for inclusion in core paths plan
