1.1	Through inspection, HMI aim to promote improvement in all of our schools and innovation that enhances learners' experiences as well as providing assurance to stakeholders. HMI focus on the quality of young people's learning and outcomes and the school's capacity to improve.			
1.2	2 HMI evaluate how well a school is performing in a range of key areas. They use qual indicators (QIs) from How good is our school 4th Edition.			
	HMI carry out inspections using a variety of models. This includes a full model inspection which covers four QIs, and a short model inspection which covers two QIs.			
	The full inspection model used in Wick High School use quality indicators (Qis) from HGIOS4 which evaluate on a six-point scale: 1.3 Leadership of Change			
	 2.3 Learning, Teaching and Assessment 3.2 Raising Attainment and Achievement 3.1 Ensuring Wellbeing, Equality and Inclusion 			
	A further QI for focus is also chosen by the school. This QI will not be evaluated using the six-point scale.

4.	Overview			
4.1	HMI from Education Scotland visited Tongue Primary School and Nursery class in			
	December 2022. During the visit, they talked to parents/carers and young people and			
	worked closely with the Headteacher and staff.			
	Tongue Primary School and Nursery Class are part of the North Coast Campus. The			
	campus Headteacher has overall responsibility for Farr High School, Farr Primary			
	School, Melvich Primary School, Tongue Primary School and the nursery settings at			
	each of the primary schools. At the time of the inspection Tongue Primary School had			
	the support of a depute headteacher (0.5) who was also a principal teacher (0.5). The			
	DHT also had responsibility for Farr Primary and Tongue Nursery Class. The DHT was			
	in Tongue Primary School, three days each week. There was also another principal			
4.0	teacher (0.5).			
4.2	The inspection team found the following strengths in the school's work.			
	- Across the school and nursery, children are friendly, polite and welcoming. They			
	are proud of the work they do to improve the quality of their local environment. They are motivated and engage well in their learning.			
	- The resilience and flexibility of the headteacher and depute headteacher. They			
	overcome challenges well to make sure children's learning continues as			
	planned. They work very effectively together to support all children and families,			
	who they know well.			
	 Staff in the nursery and school use the rich outdoor environment and local 			
	community regularly, as places to learn. This enhances the quality of			
	experiences for all children.			
	- Children understand well how environmental issues affect their local area. They			
	are proud of the valuable contributions they make to the wider community			
4.3	helping to improve the village environment The following areas for improvement were identified and discussed with the			
4.5	headteacher and a representative from The Highland Council.			
	- Staff should continue with plans to develop the curriculum across the nursery			
	and school. They should ensure there is clear progression in children's skills			
	across all aspects of learning.			
	- In the nursery and school, continue to develop the approaches used to show			
	how much and how well children progress overtime.
