# **Purpose/Executive Summary**

**Description:** Grid connected battery energy storage facility of up to 200MW,

comprising of electrical equipment including batteries, access track, transmission compound, switchgear, control buildings, stores, fencing,

security, landscaping, parking, and ancillary structures.

**Ward:** 05 – Wester Ross, Strathpeffer and Lochalsh

## 1.0 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 This report informs the Planning Applications Committee of the submission of the attached Proposal of Application Notice (PAN).
- 1.2 The submission of the PAN accords with the provisions of the Planning etc. (Scotland) Act 2006 and was made valid on 1 August 2023. The PAN is a statutory requirement for planning applications for major or national developments and must be lodged at least 12 weeks prior to the submission of a planning application. Members are asked to note this may form the basis of a subsequent planning application.
- 1.3 The submitted information attached includes:
  - Proposal of Application Notice (Application Form)
  - Location Plan
- 1.4 There have been two in-person consultation events, the first took place on Wednesday 6 September 2023 between 3pm and 7pm at Lochluichart Hall, and the second on Wednesday 20 September 2023 between 3pm and 7pm at Lochluichart Hall. Both events were advertised on 1 September 2023 in the Ross-shire Journal.
- 1.5 Details of all notified parties are contained / appended to the PAN form and include Garve and District Community Council, as well as local Members. The applicant undertook a letter drop to advise the public of the consultation events to households and businesses within a 2.5km radius of the site. - 1.6 Any forthcoming application will be accompanied by a Pre-Application Consultation (PAC) report explaining the consultation undertaken, feedback received, and any resultant amendments made to the planning application.

#### 2.0 DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

- 2.1 The proposal is for a grid connected battery energy storage facility of up to 200MW and associated infrastructure as well as a compound of electrical equipment including: batteries; access track; transmission compound; switchgear; control building; stores; fencing; security; landscaping; parking; and ancillary structures. The proposal would allow for up to 200MW of power to be stored and exported from the site to the electricity grid.
- 2.2 The developer has not sought formal pre-application advice from the Planning Authority through the Pre-Application Advice Service for Major Developments.

#### 3.0 SITE DESCRIPTION

3.1 The PAN boundary covers approximately of 754 hectares taking in the existing Corriemoillie Substation. The entire southern boundary is located adjacent to the A832. There is a small cluster of sparsely located residential properties to both the south west and the east of the proposed site boundary.

3.2 A section of the Coille Ceann Loch Luichart Ancient Woodland is present within the western boundary of the site. There are no other natural heritage designations within the site boundary nor is the site within connectivity distance of any Special Protection Area (SPA), Special Area of Conservation (SAC), or Sites of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI). The site falls wholly within the Rounded Hills and Moorland Slopes – Ross and Cromarty Landscape Character Type as defined by NatureScot's Landscape Character Assessment. There are no Core Paths within the site or within close proximity to the boundary, there are also no Listed Buildings or Scheduled Monuments in the vicinity of the site.
