Purpose/Executive Summary

Description: Swarclett Wind Farm - erection and operation of a wind farm,

comprising 2 turbines with a maximum blade tip height of 149.9m,

battery storage and ancillary infrastructure.

Ward: 02 – Thurso and North West Caithness

1.0 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 This report informs the Planning Applications Committee of the submission of the attached Proposal of Application Notice (PAN).
- 1.2 The submission of the PAN accords with the provisions of the Planning etc. (Scotland) Act 2006 and was made valid on 29 September 2023. The PAN is a statutory requirement for planning applications for major or national developments and must be lodged at least 12 weeks prior to the submission of a planning application. Members are asked to note this may form the basis of a subsequent planning application.
- 1.3 The submitted information attached includes:
 - Proposal of Application Notice (Application Form)
 - Location Plan
- 1.4 There have been two in-person consultation events, the first took place on Tuesday 11 July 2023 between 4pm and 7pm at Castletown Drill Hall, and the second on Wednesday 26 July 2023 between 4pm and 7pm at Bower Community Centre. The first event was advertised on 28 June 2023 in the Caithness Courier and on 30 June 2023 in the John o Groats Journal. The second event was advertised on 19 July 2023 also in the Caithness Courier and on 21 July 2023 in the John o Groats Journal.
- 1.5 Details of all notified parties are contained / appended to the PAN form and include Bower and Castletown Community Councils, as well as local Members, Members of Scottish Parliament and Members of Parliament. The applicant undertook a letter drop to advise the public of the consultation events. The applicant also included QR codes within these letters which would link directly to their feedback form.
- 1.6 Any forthcoming application will be accompanied by a Pre-Application Consultation (PAC) report explaining the consultation undertaken, feedback received, and any resultant amendments made to the planning application.

2.0 DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

- 2.1 The proposal consists of 2 turbines up to a maximum 149.9m blade tip height and battery storage and ancillary infrastructure. The wind turbine generators will have an indicative output of approximately 9.6 MW and an indicative battery storage capacity of up to 12 MW, resulting in a total capacity of 21.6 MW.
- 2.2 The developer a sought an EIA Scoping Response from the Planning Authority in March 2022 for the erection and operation of a wind farm comprising 4 turbines of up to 149.9m blade tip height and ancillary infrastructure (ref. 22/00790/SCOP).

3.0 SITE DESCRIPTION

3.1 The PAN boundary covers approximately of 34 hectares. There are no other natural heritage designations within the site boundary nor is the site within connectivity distance of any Special Protection Area (SPA), Special Area of Conservation (SAC),

or Sites of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI). The topography of the site and surround area is relatively flat with slight inclines and vast open agricultural areas.

3.2 The site falls wholly within the Farmed Lowland Plain Landscape Character Type as defined by NatureScot's Landscape Character Assessment and is approximately 4.5 km south of Castletown. There are no Core Paths however the track and wider area is subject to the Land Reform (Scotland) Act 2003 where members of the public may reasonably exercise their rights to public access. There are no Listed Buildings or Scheduled Monuments in the vicinity of the site however there are three Listed Buildings within 3 km of the proposed site boundary which are as follows:
