Purpose/Executive Summary

Description: Extension of existing wind farm at Lochend to encompass a further 21

MW of wind generation capacity through 5 wind turbines each of up to 149.9 m to tip height, plus battery energy storage. Related infrastructure

including circa 1.5 km od access track and turbine foundations.

Ward: 02 – Thurso and North West Caithness

1.0 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 This report informs the Planning Applications Committee of the submission of the attached Proposal of Application Notice (PAN).
- 1.2 The submission of the PAN accords with the provisions of the Planning etc. (Scotland) Act 2006 and was made valid on 18th October 2023. The PAN is a statutory requirement for planning applications for major or national developments and must be lodged at least 12 weeks prior to the submission of a planning application. Members are asked to note this may form the basis of a subsequent planning application.
- 1.3 The submitted information attached includes:
 - Proposal of Application Notice (Application Form)
 - Location / Site Layout Plan.
- 1.4 There will be thee in-person consultation events, the first two took place on Wednesday 6th and Thursday 21st September 2023 3pm and 7pm at Northern Sands Hotel, Dunnet. The third took place on Tuesday 7th November 2023 between 3pm and 7pm at Northern Sands Hotel, Dunnet. The first event was advertised on 1st September 2023 in the John O'Groat Journal, as such did not comply with the requirements of being advertised a minimum of 7 days prior to the public consultation event, resulting in further consultation having to be undertaken. The second event was advertised on 8th September 2023 and the third event on 20th October 2023, meeting the required public consultation statutory period.
- 1.5 Details of all notified parties are contained / appended to the PAN form and include Dunnet and Canisbay, Castletown, Bower, Watten and Sinclair Bay Community Councils, as well as local Members.
- 1.6 Any forthcoming application will be accompanied by a Pre-Application Consultation (PAC) report explaining the consultation undertaken, feedback received, and any resultant amendments made to the planning application.

2.0 DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

- 2.1 The proposal is for the construction and operation of a wind farm comprising up to 5 turbines with a blade tip height of up to 149.9m and ancillary infrastructure with an installed capacity of up to 21MW. The proposal is described as an extension to Lochend Wind Farm that consists of 4 turbines in a linear array with tip height of 99.5m.
- 2.2 The developer sought formal pre-application advice from the Planning Authority through the Pre-Application Advice Service for Major Developments in 2022 for the erection and operation of 5 wind turbines with blade tip of 150m (HC ref. 21/05707/PREMAJ).
- 2.3 The Pre-Application set out that the proposed development will re-use as much of the existing site as possible, with the main elements of the Proposed Development would therefore be as follows:
 - Five wind turbines, each up to a maximum height to tip of 149.5 m.

- foundations for each wind turbine;
- crane hardstanding at each turbine location;
- new on-site access tracks with associated watercourse crossings, if required;
- use of existing on-site access tracks, with widening of corners;
- underground cable arrays within the site (connecting the turbines to the Existing Site's substation);
- Use of the spare capacity within the existing control building;
- temporary construction compound(s) and laydown area(s);

In addition, the following ancillary works may be necessary:

- concrete batching plant; and
- off-site public road improvements

A variety of infrastructure and a number of existing access tracks already stand as part of the existing Site and will be used by the Proposed Development, to reduce environmental impact and construction time.

3.0 SITE DESCRIPTION

- 3.1 The PAN boundary covers approximately of 215 hectares, this includes the existing Lochend Wind Farm (HC ref. 13/02682/FUL) and associated infrastructure. The proposed site is located in northeast Caithness approximately 8km southwest of John O'Groats, approximately 16km east of Thurso and approximately 17km northwest of Wick. There are a number of dispersed residential properties within 2km of the site boundary, as such any further application will require a Residential Visual Amenity Assessment (RVAA) to assess the effects of visual amenity for these properties.
- 3.2 The Site is located on rough grassland, much of which unimproved and boggy. Most of the Site area is within the Sweeping Moorland and Flows (LCT134), and the western edge falls within the Farmed Lowland Plain (LCT143). The topography is softly undulating with pockets of forestry. There are no Core Paths within the site, however the site and the wider area are subject to the Land Reform (Scotland) Act 2003 where members of the public may reasonably exercise their rights to public access. There are no Listed Buildings or Scheduled Monuments within the site, however there are Listed Buildings within the study area which are as follows:

The wider area is known for archaeological interests, as such there is likely a number of heritage assets that will require the Applicant's consideration.

- 3.3 The site is not located in an area subject to landscape designation. However, the Hoy and West Mainland National Scenic Area (NSA), on Orkney, is located approximately 26km north-west of the proposed site. Furthermore, within the study area there are the following Special Landscape Areas:
