General agreement from members it is a good report and easy to read. Deborah asked about the rate of referrals to SCRA and why it is so high in Highland? Historically Highland has a higher rate than the national average and the QA sub-group has looked into this and reported that they are all appropriate. Karen has looked at the referrals (and more training is being delivered next week to the hub) and reviews are regularly taken to check appropriateness. 		<ul> <li>practitioner, write their own story to communicate with a trusted professional. It will give young people a voice and they can choose how and when they use it.</li> <li>It has built in surveys and will help with data gathering around the voice of the child. It should be noted that many staff have been involved to ensure due diligence and it is ours for 3 years. A champions group has also been created to help spread the word and support staff.</li> <li>It is administered through social work services but can be used and linked with other agencies and the 3<sup>rd</sup> sector - who are in a good position to help 'pre-crisis' and are keen to be involved.</li> <li>It is part of a suite of initiatives for hearing children's voices and is about giving young people a choice in how they are heard.</li> <li>➢ Sadie is reaching out to statutory partners, Highlife Highland and the 3<sup>rd</sup> sector around hearing young people's voices and will send finding to Clair.</li> <li>Barnardos are working with WhoCaresScotland (5 – 26 years) to gather views on Scottish policies. The event in Inverness is being held on 30/11/2024.</li> <li>➢ Wendy will send the information as soon as possible for Mhairi to circulate</li> <li>Who Cares Scotland are planning to consult with young people in 3 categories: 8 to 11 years, 12 to 15 years and 16+ years.</li> </ul>	ASAP	Sadie/Clair Wendy
7.	Child Sexual Abuse Input and Discussion	<ul> <li>Mhairi sits on the National Working Group for Child Sexual Abuse (CSE) and will report back to this committee with updates.</li> <li>Donna outlined the reasons for looking at CSA due to noticing low numbers of children being placed on the register for this concern (national issue).</li> <li>Donna presented a slide show to the group, thanking Jonathan for the data. There has been discussion around prevention programmes and need to think about youth and community.</li> <li>Also need to think about our recovery support, talking about services for under 13 year-olds (Bairns Hoose) and we need to include adult services in terms of how we work with perpetrators, supporting all parties safely. We need to look at staff confidence to identify sexual abuse and how to respond to disclosure. This is happening nationally so Highland is not unique.</li> <li>Have brought it here for discussion and would like it added into our new Improvement Plan. AGREED.</li> </ul>		Donna

		<ul> <li>Nancy advised there is a rise in IRDs but it is not transferring to child protection statistics and it would be interesting to know why.</li> <li>Youth Highland have direct contact with community members and must ensure the right information, training and support is given and is a large part of the work they are doing. It puts more boots on the ground and improves confidence.</li> <li>3<sup>rd</sup> sector organisations have consistent contacts in the community so people know who to go to with concerns which can help with early intervention. We are seeing a rise in young people concerned about each other's behaviour and normalisation of certain behaviours and what is the youth work role in supporting this. There is a lack of understanding by young people of what is and isn't appropriate. Youth workers are struggling with inappropriate behaviour and how can we work together in this.</li> <li>Historically there has always been a difference between prevalence and reporting of CSA.</li> <li>It would be helpful to look at a sample of children discussed at IRD to understand and establish their journey and are we putting in the right support and intervention.</li> <li>In terms of the Whole Family Wellbeing programme and the self - assessment toolkit around, if we utilise it across organisations (particularly 3<sup>rd</sup> sector) to raise awareness of available training. Provide a holistic whole family support space.</li> <li>Fiona mentioned Peer on Peer sharing element of indecent images. There is CSE training on the calendar, one already delivered and another being held in November so please share – open to all. It has been distributed through the CPC What's On calendar.</li> <li>Donna noted we will be delving deeper into the IRDs. Have also been in contact with the NSPCC for support in delivering a snapshot of where we are in Highland. There is a small cost but it could prove a welcome tool and she will share it with the committee.</li> </ul>		
8.	Safe and Together Update (papers attached)	Mike advised that notification is due next month from the Scottish Government (SG) confirming if funding will continue into 2025/26. Mike is part of the Northern Collaborative which is looking at alternatives for delivering S & T – sharing trainers and resources – and how it can be costed and support for trained practitioners is now available through the Moray on- line forums. NO.		<ul> <li>It is hoped that as a large collaborative we can influence the national S &amp; T model, which is being developed, so that it is not urban centric. Uptake of training is detailed in the attached papers and also to report the positive reaction to the face to face sessions and the appreciation of working alongside colleagues from other agencies again.</li> <li>It should be noted that costs have reduced by 50% as a result of in-person training and cross-agency training is becoming recognised as a beneficial and popular approach.</li> <li>Next month (12<sup>th</sup> December) at the North American and European Workshop Mike is presenting on the multi-agency approach to S &amp; T training – high profile for Highland.</li> <li>Mike met with Sheila Hagney (East-Ayrshire) as they have undertaken a self-evaluation, including case file auditing, and she will be joining the steering group meeting on 27/11/2024 to discuss.</li> <li>Also in discussion with Women's Aid and RASASH to look at the 3<sup>rd</sup> stage of the S &amp; T evaluation and what is called a 'Survivor Journey Study' which is a detailed case study looking at how women access services and charting their journey through the process, what does and doesn't work and where there are barriers. It will be undertaken with Improvement Services but won't start until next year.</li> <li>Chair - Thanks to Mike for all his work and it is interesting to see what other authorities are doing.</li> <li>This is being discussed at QA group and when auditing we need to be coherent and integrated.</li> <li>The significance of the work Mike is doing to promote Highland nationally and internationally should not underestimated and the Northern Alliance is critical.</li> </ul>		
9.	Pre-birth and Early Years Input and Discussion	Claire talked the meeting through a slideshow (below). MDO Brief Presentation for VPP I Margaret noted this work forms part of the post-inspection workplan. It is critically important, data led work and will evidence our strengthening partnership. These are our most at risk, vulnerable children and thank you for all your work. In addition to baby deaths there are also maternal suicides. The right support at the right time is crucial. Supporting Roots and Born Into Care in Scotland – IRISS</li> <li>How we record and make sense of child concern forms is being looked into and still at the investigation stage, but it does vary from team to team.</li> <li>Please feed any work being done on child concern forms through L &amp; D so it can be put out through formal training</li> <li>First meeting of the Pre-Birth and Early Years Group will be on 26/11/2024.</li> <li>Donna advised that The Infant Pledge will feed into the plan.</li> <li>Group has been working on the Consulting with Younger Children Toolkit (including non-verbal children).</li> <li>Have been contacted Jennifer MacDonald and Gillian Forbes (PEEP) who are looking to bring in Dan Wouri (an early childcare specialist from the USA) and he will be attending their Early Years Event at Eden Court on 03/03/2025.</li> <li>CPC is supporting in this and aim to relaunch the Consulting with Younger children toolkit on that day.
