Report Title: Food in Schools Project – Progress Update

#### 1. Purpose/Executive Summary

- 1.1 Following the meeting of the Redesign Board workshop on 20 March 2025 Officers implemented feedback received from Elected Members when designing the planned surveys. These surveys provide opportunities for change within the provision of food in schools in the Highland Council area.
- 1.2 This report provides an update on the emerging outcomes from the surveys.

#### 2. Recommendations

- 2.1 Members are asked to:
  - i. Consider the progress to date.
  - ii. Agree that the draft action plan will be considered by the Redesign Board in November 2025.

#### 3. Implications

- 5. Food in Schools Delivering Sustainability
- 5.1 The project has a RAG status of Green with activity on track.



- 5.2 The Redesign Board are reminded that the 4 key initial areas of work within this project as agreed at the Redesign Board held on the 2 October 2024 are:
  - Take-up rates (FSM)
  - Income generation
  - Operating model
  - Cost of food
- 5.3 The most recent activity for the project related to the design and issue of stakeholder consultation surveys based on feedback from Members at the Redesign Board Meeting on 20 March 2025. Surveys were designed using a collaborative approach involving guidance from Members and colleagues from Catering Services. Different surveys were designed to meet the requirements of 8 different stakeholder groups as listed below.

Surveys were issued in late May 2025 and the surveys closed on 4 July 2025. For ease of reference, survey forms are attached at Appendix 1.

In total 5,009 responses were received by 4 July 2025 from all secondary and special schools and over 95% of primary schools. Officers are extremely grateful to all those who took the time to participate in the survey. The depth and breadth of responses enables the Council to be assured of a highly representative sample of stakeholders. Initial high-level analysis of results has been undertaken, and this will inform the Redesign Board workshop following this meeting.




