5. CJP Restructuring

a. Terms of Reference

The ToR had been redrafted. With the addition of a clause stating that members may send a substitute if unable to attend, the draft was approved for submission to the HCPP Board. (Note: Following the meeting, updated HCPP ToR were received, indicating the need to amend the HCJP ToR to ensure consistency. This amendment was agreed by email.) Individual ToR had also been prepared for the two Delivery Groups, and these were approved.

- b. Diversions and Interventions Delivery Group A copy of the note of the meeting was attached for information. Sarah highlighted a number of matters. The group was still at the formative stage, and work was ongoing to finalise the delivery plan. The group was particularly aware of the challenges emerging around 16-17 year olds and of the need to better understand the different process people face when entering into the Justice system.
- c. Transitions Delivery Group

Kerry spoke to the note of the meeting which was attached. Amongst the key issues was the need to effectively embed new Throughcare processes locally. Recruitment to the new service *Upside* had been a challenge, but it was anticipated that Turning Point Scotland (the local delivery partner) would be at full strength in the next month or so.

An additional challenge was the breadth of the group's agenda, and the need for flexibility in how the group will be structured. It was agreed that we invite Karen Watson, Upside Throughcare Service Manager, to speak to a future HCJP Strategic Group meeting.

There was wider discussion about the gaps in provision for people in crisis or distress. Judy indicated that this had been identified as a priority by the Crisis Intervention, Recovery & Support Group, a subgroup of the HCPP Mental Health & Wellbeing Delivery Group. The group are looking at the gaps in provision for people in crisis or distress but who do not require an acute service through New Craigs. There is

recognition that Police are often involved as a result of a lack of other options to support people in crisis or distress.

The group have been looking at facilities/services across Scotland which are providing a *'Right place, right time'* approach to intervention, and Judy is currently working with Highland Council to seek transformation monies for a feasibility study/research project to identify the scale of, and best approaches to address the problems identified, including the demand for such services across Highland and what currently is in place.

6. Finance

a. Update

There was no update available, however, it was reported that JSW were still awaiting funding confirmation (including CJP funding) for the current year.

b. Small Grants

A report was attached outlining four applications which had been received. The processes for application and selection had been kept proportionate to the level of funding being offered.

A panel consisting of James Maybee, Kate MacLean, Maria Cano and Gabrielle Buist considered the applications.

Successful applicants are expected to provide end of project reports (and where necessary, interim reports).

Three applications were successful:

Albyn Housing (use of Fit Homes technology to support tenants who have been involved with the justice system) £8,000 (50%) Police Scotland (support for provision of technology to identified victims at risk, and exposed to vulnerabilities) £3,480 (100%) Scottish Drugs Forum (Prison Pathways, vocational learning for prisoners) £6,400 (100%)

The fourth application from UHI (Pathways to education and employment for up to 12 young men) had been agreed in principle, pending exploration of match funding and possible wider partnership working.

A question was raised about the implications of equalities legislation for a male only project. Amongst the aims of the project were the addressing of issues of masculinity, misogyny and wider male behaviours which were considered to be a positive use of resource. It was acknowledged that if we were formally commissioning a service then an EIA would have been necessary.

7. CJP Draft Delivery Plan

a. Annual Return 2024-25

b. Restorative Justice

c. Victims of Crime

A new manager has been appointed by VSS, Emma Todea. James has met with her, and she has joined the RJ Steering group. It is agreed that engagement with those working with victims of crime and their families remains a priority and the support team will be proactive in strengthening links with these partners.

d. Lived Experience

The planned meeting with JSW had to be cancelled, and will be rearranged. Links have been explored with other user-focussed groups including Next Chapter Scotland and Scottish Drugs Forum. (See manager update)

e. Communications

Gabrielle's work to promote Community Justice and especially CPO's and unpaid work as well as developing the social media profile was noted.

It was agreed that we should seek to develop a more cohesive approach to communication across partners. Each partner has their own priorities, but working towards shared language, coordinated approaches and consistent messages would help move things forward. We can learn from HADP approaches in recent years. It was agreed that a meeting of communications reps from partners be convened to discuss how best to progress this.

8.	HCJP Manager Update Kevin's report was attached, and all of the updated activity was referenced throughout the agenda. Kevin thanked everyone who had inputted to the restructuring exercise,	
	especially those who had taken on additional responsibilities.	
9.	Custody Link Project Update Alan spoke to the report which had been submitted, highlighting the following points: a. A stakeholder meeting had taken place to review referral criteria and operational boundaries. In the light of the shift towards presumption of bail, it was agreed that referrals for more serious offences be considered. Also, whilst there is a desire to extend the service to 16 and 17 year olds, changes in legislative frameworks (and operational processes) would need consideration before adopting such a change. b. Arrest Referral is being promoted nationally by Police Scotland, and Alan has contributed to this process, including delivering a presentation at a national event. There are ongoing conversations with other local authorities, as they consider options. c. There are the continuing challenges around the provision of emergency accommodation, support for women with children and access to substance use and mental health services.	
10.	Senior Development Officer Update Gabrielle referred to some key points from her update report: a. Plans were well advanced for the Restorative Justice event in September. It was fully booked, with a waiting list for any cancellations. The support of UHI, CJS and others was noted. RJ training is available from CJS in September. This is focussed on practitioners. Those interested should speak with Gabrielle. b. The research on Women's Projects across Scotland has been shared widely through other CJP's/COSLA and other networks, and has been well received. The final version is now available. Women's Programmes around Scotland - April 2025 Highland Community Justice Partnership Sarah outlined progress within JSW with the development of a Women's SMART group and discussions with NHS/CFSW around the needs of pregnant clients.	

c. There is continuing work to support CPO teams and the development of unpaid work placements. Alongside this has been awareness raising and the sharing of good news stories through social media and local newspapers.
