The Police continued to manage day-to-day licencing activities, which included the monitoring of licensed premises and personal licence holders, and the administration of licensing applications received, to ensure that the licensing objectives and operating plans were being adhered to.

Advice, guidance and support was offered where needed, so that licensed premises could operate successfully and in line with the licensing objectives. Any incidents were reviewed individually and any course of action would be decided in line with national guidance.

In response to a question, there was no identified reason for the reduction in recorded inspections compared to the previous year.

Information was sought in terms of drug and alcohol incidents. This would be provided to Members outside of this meeting and in due course.

The applicant's solicitor spoke in support of the application.

This would be the seventh Home Bargains store in Highland, and the second in Inverness. The alcohol on offer would reflect other stores. This would be a limited range of largely beers, wines and ciders, with occasional spirits in gift packs during the festive period. The store would have full CCTV and the Challenge 25 policy would be operated. Staff would be trained and there would be prompts at the tills. It was anticipated that the store would open at the end of November 2025.

In response to a question, the Licensing Standards Officer confirmed that although the original application had requested a display capacity of over 30m2, this had since been reduced to under the threshold of overprovision.

The Board **AGREED** to **GRANT** the provisional premises licence subject to the mandatory conditions only.

Space constraints for both patrons and staff were acknowledged and the extension and variation would address these. All necessary planning permissions had been obtained.

During discussion, clarification was sought, and provided, in terms of the 2300 hrs termination hour in the outdoor drinking area. There was no residential area in the vicinity and there would be no live or recorded music outside.
