(b) to a future meeting of the Committee when the applications will be determined in terms of the Hearings Procedure.

Review of taxi tariff 2025/2026

Tagsaidh 2025/2026**

There had been circulated Report No HLC/134/25 by the Principal Solicitor relating to the statutory requirement to undertake, and complete, a review of the Council's taxi tariff within 18 months of the current tariff coming into effect.

The Committee **AGREED** a draft tariff to go out for public consultation for a period of 28 days as follows:

- **Tariff 1** – no change to current tariff
- **Tariff 2** – no change to current tariff
- **Tariff 3** – no change to current tariff
- **Tariff 4** – no change to current tariff
- **Tariff 5** – no change to current tariff
- **New Tariff proposed** – not to implement this.

Extra Charges

- **Booking ahead by the phone charge** – no change to current charge
- **Bridge Tolls, Ferry and Airport Car Parking charges** – no change to current charges
- **Supplementary Bookings charge** – no change to current charge
- **Soiling charge** – no change to current charge
- **Luggage charge** – maximum charge to be increased from £5 to £10.

There had been circulated Report No HLC/135/25 by the Principal Solicitor inviting the Committee to: (i) note the 44 responses received following the public consultation; (ii) consider the responses contained in the report and decide whether Members wish to proceed with introducing knowledge testing for PHC drivers.

Dr C Birt, seconded by Mr J Grafton, **MOVED** to introduce a knowledge test for Private Hire Car drivers.

As an **AMENDMENT**, Mrs J Hendry, seconded by Ms E Knox, moved not to introduce a knowledge test for Private Hire Car drivers.

On a vote being taken, the **MOTION** received 5 votes and the **AMENDMENT** received 5 votes, with no abstentions, the votes having been cast as follows:-

Decision

The Committee **AGREED:**

- to introduce a knowledge test for Private Hire Car (PHC) drivers;
- the knowledge test will apply to new applicants only or existing drivers that fail to re-apply timeously;
- the knowledge test will come into effect from 1 September 2026;

- the pass mark will be the same as with the current taxi driver knowledge test, namely 85% for the local area section and 75% for the Highland wide section; and
- this will be reviewed after 3 years of coming into force.

The Committee **AGREED** to **GRANT** the renewal of the licence with the standard conditions, subject to the applicant providing a certificate of compliance confirming that the notice has been displayed at the premises for the required 21 day period.

Thereafter, the Committee **AGREED to REFUSE** the licence application under paragraph 5(3)(d) of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 that there is other good reason for refusing the application, being that the applicant is not the owner of the premises and the applicant has failed to provide a declaration confirming that the owner consents to the application, as required under paragraph 5 (c) of Schedule 2 of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 (Licensing of Short-term Lets) Order 2022.

14.3 Application for grant of a short term let licence – Smithy Croft, Station Road, Carrbridge, PH23 3AL
