North of Scotland EV Infrastructure project

On 16 October, the Inter-Authority Agreement and concession contract for the North of Scotland EV Infrastructure were signed. This milestone initiates the Migration phase, transitioning the Council's existing EV charging network from ChargePlace Scotland to the EZO platform, our private-sector partner. Following migration, participating Councils and EZO will install approximately 500 Pathfinder 1 charge points, significantly expanding the region's EV infrastructure.

Mock COP

The Highland Mock COP will take place on 10 November, with 11 secondary schools from across the region participating.
