1 Purpose/Executive Summary

1.1 To update Members on income generated in their area via the Invitation to Pay scheme in Council operated Car Parks.

- 5 Income from Invitation to Pay

5.1 **Amount Raised 2024/25**

Across Highland, 32 sites have generated Gross Income of:

- £337,052 for Regulated Car Parks; and
- £46,369 for Common Good Car Parks
- 5.2 The amount available for this Committee from 2024/25 after all relevant costs are deducted:-
