Report title: Application for the grant of a private hire car operator's licence – Bismillah Momand (Ward 15 – Inverness Ness-side)

1. Purpose/Executive summary

- 1.1** This report relates to an application for the grant of a private hire car operator's licence. This item is subject to a formal hearing procedure.

2. Recommendation

- 2.1** Members are asked to determine the application in accordance with the Council's hearings procedure.

3. Background

3.1 The Highland Council has resolved that in terms of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 (the "Act") a licence will be required for the operation of a private hire car (PHC). A licence for the same is issued by the Highland Council and is valid for the whole Council area.

4. Application

4.1 On 9 April 2025 an application for the grant of a PHC operator's licence was received from Mr Bismillah Momand.

4.2 In terms of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 (the Act) the Licensing Authority have nine months from receipt of the application to determine the same, therefore this application must be determined by 8 January 2026. Failure to determine the application by this time would result in the application being subject of a 'deemed grant' which means that a licence would require to be issued for a period of 1 year. The application is before this Committee as this is the last meeting before the determination date expires.

5. Process

5.1 Following receipt of the application a copy of the same was circulated to the following Agencies/Services for consultation:

- Police Scotland
- Trading Standards Service

5.2 There have been no objections received in relation to this application.

6. Vehicle inspection, meter test and documentation

6.1 Mr Momand has still to present his vehicle for an inspection and meter test and submit a copy of his insurance certificate. An update in relation to these outstanding matters will be provided to the Committee at the meeting.

6.2 In view of the above a licence is unable to be issued under delegated powers at this time and, as indicated in 4.2 of the report, the period for determining the application is due to expiry shortly.

7. Determining issues

7.1 Paragraph 5(3) of Schedule 1 of the Act states that a licensing authority shall refuse an application to grant or renew a licence where:

- (a) the applicant or anyone else detailed on the application is not a fit and proper person;
- (b) the activity would be carried out by a person other than the applicant who, if he had made the application himself, would have been refused;
- (c) where the licence applied for relates to an activity consisting of or including the use of premises or a vehicle or vessel, those premises are not or, as the case may be, that vehicle or vessel is not suitable or convenient for the conduct of the activity having regard to

- (i) the location, character or condition of premises or the character or condition of the vehicle or vessel,
- (ii) the nature and extent of the proposed activity,
- (iii) the kind of persons likely to be in the premises, vehicle or vessel,
- (iv) the possibility of undue public nuisance, or
- (v) public order or public safety; or

(d) there is other good reason for refusing the application.

7.2 If required the Principal Solicitor – Regulatory Services will offer particular advice on the criteria relating to this particular application.

7.3 A copy of this report has been sent to the applicant who has been invited to attend and will be provided with an opportunity to be heard by the Committee. They have also been advised of the procedure which will be followed at the meeting.
