1. Purpose/Executive Summary

- 1.1 This report provides an update of key information in relation to the schools within the Inverness High Associated School Group (ASG) and provides useful updated links to further information in relation to these schools.
- 1.2 The primary schools in this area serve 789 pupils, ELC settings serve 196 children (117 in LA settings and 79 in Partner settings as at September Census), with the secondary school serving 482 young people.



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


