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1. Introduction

- East Nairnshire, whose community council is in abeyance

(collectively 'Nairnshire')

The Plan and this statement have been prepared by, and in accordance with:

The Plan covers Nairnshire, stretching from the beaches to the north boundary with the Inner Moray Firth to the foothills of the Cairngorms beyond Ferness, and East to West between Tornagrain and Forres catchments. This is clearly identified in The Plan.

The Plan comprises 6 sections, and is structured around 5 key themes:

- Sustainable Futures;
- Jobs and Business;
- Getting Around;
- Town and Village Centres; and
- Green Space and Leisure

We trust that the Council will find our suggestions helpful, along with those from other communities, as it develops the Highland Local Development Plan. This is an opportunity to use planning policy and other levers to more effectively tackle issues to communities across the Highlands such as enabling more active travel and public/community transport, affordable housing for working people, and access to services, facilities and opportunities.

Your last date for responding is by close of business on Thursday 27th February 2025.
