Who can become a Community Councillor?

Anyone aged **16 and over**, and on the electoral register for that area. Anyone interested in making their community a better place to live.

How do I become a Community Councillor?

You must complete an online nomination form which will be available from the council's website at www.highland.gov.uk/ccelections during the nomination timeframe.

Nomination and Election

If there are more candidate than places for any community council after the close of nominations, an election by postal ballot will be held. Voters will be able to choose to elect candidates up to the number of maximum places available.

If the number of candidates equals or less than the number of places available, the candidates will be duly elected, and a community council will be formed.
