THE HIGHLAND COUNCIL (A832 TORE)
(40 MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 1996

The Highland Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the said Act, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as "The Highland Council (A832 Tore) (40 mph Speed Limit) Order, 1996 and shall come into operation on 24 October 1996.
2. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
3. No person shall drive or cause or permit any vehicle to be driven at a speed in excess of 40 miles per hour over the length of road specified in the Schedule hereto.

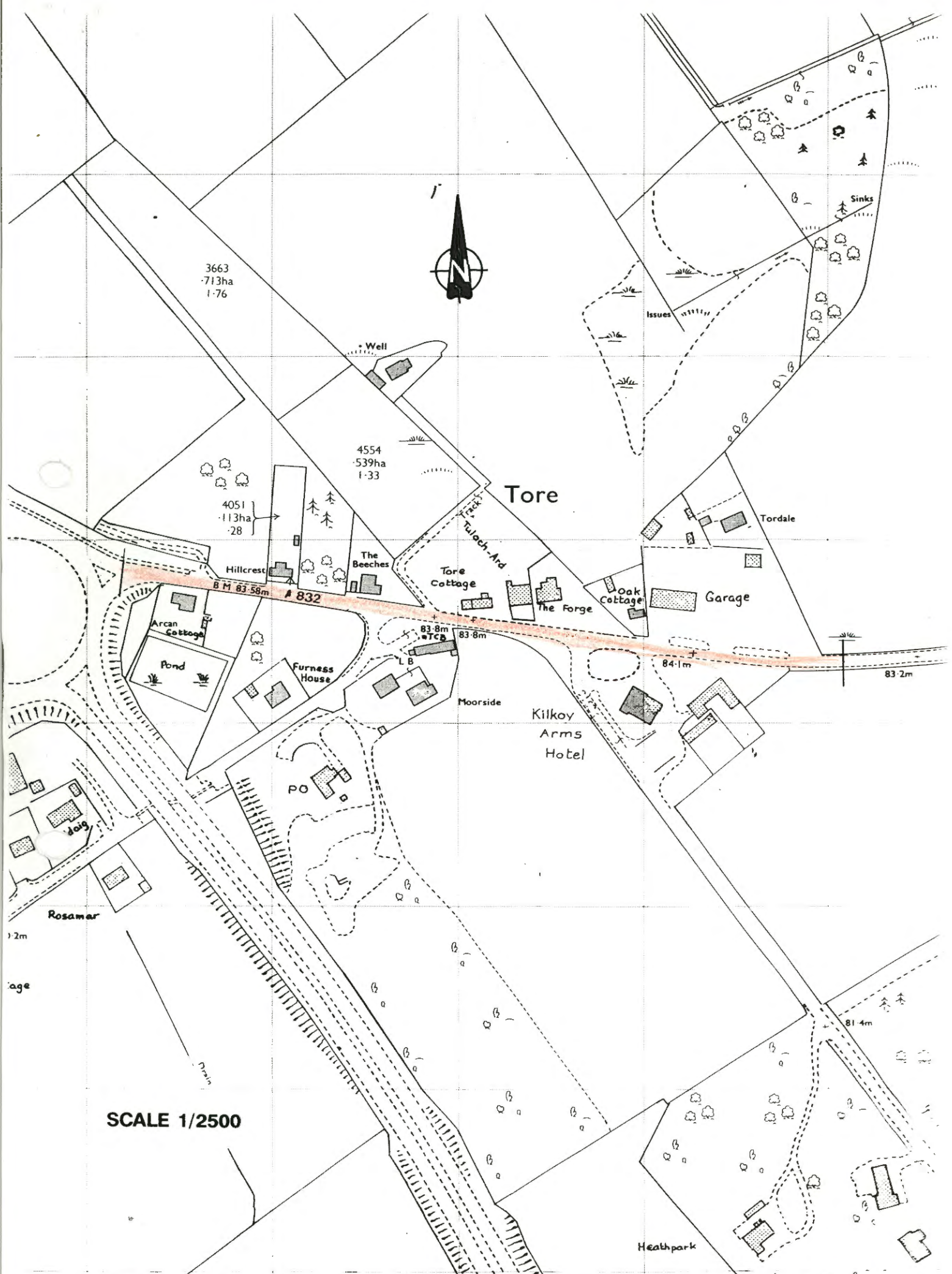

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that The Highland Council on 2 September 1996 made, in terms of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the above Order which will come into operation on 24 October 1996.

The Order was previously advertised by Notice in The Edinburgh Gazette on 31 May 1996 No.23997, Page 1339 reference 92 and in the Ross-shire Journal on 7 June 1996 and the effect of the Order is as described in that Notice.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or any of its provisions on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that a requirement of that Act or of the relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with may, within six weeks from the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the Court of Session.
